
INTRODUCING PARSHA PEARLS

Don't we all like to start a book at the beginning? It wouldn't make sense to start a book half-way through or at the end because then we won't get a true picture of what the story is all about. We will only get part of the picture or maybe very little and that is why Yahweh introduces His story with the words, "In (the) Beginning". In Hebrew the word is Bereishit. We will learn many Hebrew words as we study Yahweh's Word through the parshas and hopefully we will commit them to memory and use them when we speak to our friends, parents and Sabbath school teachers. Parsha is another word to know. It means 'portion or divide' and we will have a weekly Scripture portion to go through the Torah cycle. Torah is another word to know. Torah means 'teaching and instruction' and generally refers to the first 5 books of the Scriptures also known as the books of Mosheh (Moses). Don't worry if this seems overwhelming. We'll take it week by week and rest assured you will have fun finding treasures in His Word.

Yahweh starts the Scriptures with the words, "In (the) Beginning" because He wants to give us a complete story of His journey with man. This is because He loves us and wants to let us know what He was doing way before you or I were ever born. As you read this lesson, you will look up the verses in the Scriptures, so we should always have our Scriptures near us when doing the parsha studies. When you read the words of the Scriptures, imagine that Yahweh Himself is talking to you. Yahweh is teaching you Himself! We should be excited to dig into His Word and learn some lessons from our Creator.

The Scriptures talk a lot about how we should see Yahweh's Word and how it is like hidden treasure, precious jewels, better than fine silver or gold. The Scriptures also teach us that "it is the esteem of man to search out His Word and the glory of Yahweh to reveal it to us." We are told that we are Yahweh's treasured possession and so let us be like the Bereans who searched the Scriptures daily. May we always be excited, honored and humbled to know Him and treasure up His Torah in our hearts, our minds and with all our might!

So let's get digging and take a journey with Yahweh to explore the Scriptures through the parshas.





BEREISHIT OVERVIEW

"In beginning"... Bereishit

Today, we are starting the 1st book of the Torah, called Bereishit, which means 'in beginning' because the parsha starts with the words, "In (the) beginning." In English, the 1st book of the Torah is called Genesis, which means coming into being, or the generations of heaven and earth.

Our 1st year's journey through the book of Bereishit will give us a glimpse into the creation of our beautiful earth; and as we witness the flood we will gain a valuable lesson about how important it is that we follow Yahweh. We will then be introduced to each of our patriarchs and read their life-stories. Bereishit will end with Ya'aqob blessing all his 12 sons; then when we dig into the book of Shemot (Exodus) we'll see what happens to them.

Because each parsha is so rich in information, we will only be able to examine certain parts of each parsha per lesson. We do encourage parents and their children to do their own studies. In future years, we will fill in the pieces from each parsha that we did not cover previously.

Here is a breakdown of the 12 parashot in the book of Bereishit:

- Bereishit (In (the) beginning) Ch. 1-6
- Noach (Noah) Ch. 6-11
- · Lech-Lecha (Go or Leave) Ch. 12-17
- Vayeira (He appeared) Ch. 18-22
- Chayei Sarah (Sarah lived) Ch. 23-25
- Toldot (Generations) Ch. 25-28
- Vayeitzei (He went out) Ch. 28-32
- Vayishlach (He sent) Ch. 32-36
- Vayeishev (He settled) Ch. 37-40
- Mikeitz (At the end) Ch. 41-44
- Vayigash (He approached) Ch. 44-47
- · Vayechi (He lived) Ch. 47-50

Shalom children! Let's pretend I was going to read you a story. Do you want me to start at the end of the book, in the middle or at the beginning? (Allow children to answer.) It makes sense to start at the beginning, doesn't it? Well the word for beginning in Hebrew is Bereishit. Can you say that with me? (Have children repeat it.) Ok, so today we are going to talk about the beginning of the world, before there was mommy or daddy, before there was grandma or grandpa, before there was water to drink before there was grass to play on outside. But not before there was Elohim.

DAY 1

(Place #1 on board.) In the beginning, the earth was a big dark blob. (Place formless earth on board.) And Elohim said "Let light come", and the light appeared. (Place day 1 scene on board.) Elohim thought this was a good idea. He said the dark will be night time, and the light will be day time. This was what Elohim created on the 1st day.

DAY 2

(Place #2 on board.) Elohim then made the heavens by separating the waters. You see this every day when you look up at the sky. (Place day 2 scene on board.) Elohim was now done with the 2^{nd} day.

DAY 3

(Place #3 and day 3 scene on board.) Elohim had some more ideas for creation. He made seas, oceans, rivers and lakes by separating the water and the land. Do you like playing in the water on a hot day? Well Elohim did that it so we can enjoy it. Isn't He so thoughtful? Elohim then told the earth to bring up all sorts of plants and trees, and it did. (Place plants on board.) Elohim saw that this was good. Elohim was now done with the 3rd day.



DAY 4

(Place #4 on board.) Elohim made lights and put them in the sky, to separate the day from the night. One was called the sun (place sun on board), and the other one He called the moon. (Place moon on other side of board.) He said to the sun, "You can light the earth in the daytime." He told the moon, "You can light the earth at night." Isn't it thoughtful of Elohim to give us light so that we can play outside during the day and sleep when it is dark? (Place stars on board.) He also put the twinkling stars in the sky for us to enjoy. (Place day 4 scene on board.) Elohim said that this was good. Elohim was now done with the 4th day.

DAY 5

(Place #5 and day 5 scene on board.) Elohim filled the waters with fish and other water animals like whales and sharks. (Place water animals on board.) Elohim saw that this was good. Do you ever wonder how Elohim thought of each and every single animal to create? He must have had a lot of fun thinking of some of them. (Let children discuss some of the animals that Elohim created.) Elohim also filled the sky with flying animals, like doves and eagles. (Place birds on board.) Elohim was now done with the 5th day.

DAY 6

(Place #6 and day 6 scene on board.) Elohim filled the earth with all sorts of animals. He made farm animals like horses, cows, sheep and goats (place farm animals on board) and animals you may see in a zoo like large elephants and very tall giraffes or strong lions and fast tigers. (Place each animal on board as you say it). He even made your favorite pet. (Place turtle, dog and cat on board.) Elohim had to make someone to take care of all the animals. That's when He created the very 1st man. His name was Adam. (Place Adam on board.) Elohim wanted Adam to have a friend, so he also made a woman. Her name was Hawwah. (Place Hawwah on board.) Elohim was now done with the 6th day.


DAY 7


(Place #7 on board.) Elohim had worked very hard for 6 days, and He was happy with all that He had done. So, on day 7 He stopped and rested from all the work that He had done. Elohim then blessed the 7^{th} day and set it apart, and gave it to man to rest from their work too. (Place Sabbath scene on board.)



And Elohim said, "Let the waters teem with shoals of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth on the face of the expanse of the heavens."






DAYSIX

Thus the heavens and the earth were completed, and all their array. And on the seventh day Elohim completed His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had made.







Parent/Teacher Preparation:


Print Craft Templates of choice on cardstock.

Instructions for the Craft:

- If using BW Templates, color using medium of choice.
- Cut out Template A (wheel cover and pie portion) and B (days of creation base). (P1)
- Place the wheel cover over the base making sure that the pie cut-out reveals each day of creation.
- Using a puncturing tool, poke a hole through the black dot on the wheel cover and the center of the wheel base. (P2)
- Insert a brad through both holes and open up the legs on the back of the page to secure.
 (P3)
- The cover should be able to turn to reveal each day of creation. (P4, P5, P6, P7, P8, P9, P10)








SWEET TASTE OF TORAH

This snack relates to this week's parsha. Please take these as suggestions and make necessary changes based on your individual dietary needs.

6 Days of Creation

Genesis 1:1-31; 2:1-3



Here is a cute snack to represent each day of creation. These may need to be prepared ahead of time so that they can be passed out easily. Certainly the kosher gelatin required preparation ahead of time. A cupcake tin works well for presentation or just use cupcake liners on a plate which will also allow for making additional plates for the number of children you are teaching.


Ingredients:

- Cupcake tin/large plate
- Cupcake liners (for easier clean up)
- D1 Oreos or other cream cookie (represents day and night)
- D2 Kosher blue gelatin (represents water) and whipped cream (represents clouds)
- D3 Veggie Straws (represents plants) parents can choose any vegetable (such as broccoli to represent trees) or fruit they want to represent this
- D4 Happy Baby Organic Freeze Dried Yogurt (represents sun and moon) and star shaped cookies (represents stars)
- D5 Goldfish Crackers or Dollar Store whale crackers (represents sea creatures)
- D6 Animal crackers (represents land animals)
