LITTLE GEMS STORY

It's Raining, It's Pouring!

Shalom children! Welcome back to another Shabbat. Do you remember what number day of the week today is? (Allow children to answer.) That's right! It is Day 7, the day Yahweh chose for us to rest and spend time learning about Him and worshiping Him. Let's count to 7 together. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7! (Place numbers 1-7 on board as they are called out.)

Last week, we talked about how the world was created. There was the 1st daddy, Adam, and the 1st mommy, Hawwah. (Place Adam and Hawwah on board.) And all the animals. (Place animals from Bereishit on board.) Well, today we are going to talk about something that happened many, many, many years later. Adam and Hawwah had children, and they had children, and so on. This is a story about one of their great-great-grandchildren. His name was Noah.

(Remove characters from board.)

This is Noah. (Place younger Noah on board.) He had a wife and 3 sons. (Place Noah's wife and 3 sons on board.) Noah's sons were called Shem, Ham and Yepheth. (Point to each son as you say their names.) Noah loved Yahweh and taught his children to love Him too. This made Yahweh happy. (Place happy emoji on board.) But in Noah's time, there were people who did not love Yahweh. (Remove happy emoji from board) This made Yahweh sad. (Place sad emoji on board.)


Yahweh told Noah that He wanted him to build a BIG boat called an ark. It had to be big enough to hold 2 of every unclean animal He made, like large pigs and elephants. (Place 1 pair of unclean animals on board.) It also had to be big enough to hold 7 pairs of all clean animals, like cows and sheep. (Place 7 pairs of clean animals on board.) Yahweh was going to make it rain so much that there would be lots of water on the ground and even on the mountain tops. Yahweh told Noah that He was going to take care of Noah and his family. (Remove younger Noah, Noah's wife and 3 sons from board.)


It took Noah a long time to build an ark that big. (Place large ark, older Noah and older wife on board.) Noah and his wife got older and their sons got married. (Place 3 sons and wives on board.) The ark was finally ready. Noah waited for all the animals to get on the ark (place animals from Bereshith and this parsha on ark), and then his family got on the ark too. (Place family on ark.) Yahweh closed the door and it began to rain. (Remove emojis, all people and animals from board.)


It rained for 40 days and 40 nights. The water got higher and higher. (Place waves under ark.) Finally, the rain stopped. (Remove cloud with raindrops from board.) The sun came out. (Place sun in sky.) The water went down, and the ark rested on a mountain called Mt. Ararat. (Remove large ark and waves, then place mountain on board and lay small ark over mountain.) Noah wanted to see if it was safe to get out of the ark. He sent out a raven. (Place raven in sky.) He flew around but didn't find a place to rest. Next Noah sent out a dove (Remove raven from board and place dove in sky), but the dove came back because there was no place for it to rest. (Place dove near ark.)


Seven days later, Noah sent out the dove again. (Place dove back in sky.) This time the dove came back with an olive branch. (Place olive branch near dove.) Noah brought the dove back into the ark. After 2 more months, it was finally dry enough for Noah, his family, and the animals to leave the ark. (Place all people and animals on land.) Yahweh was happy with Noah and his family, and Yahweh promised Noah He would not fill the whole world with water again. Yahweh put a rainbow in the sky (place rainbow on board) to show Noah He would always keep His promise. So children, whenever you see a rainbow in the sky, think of Yahweh and His promise that He made thousands of years ago and how much He loves us all and is very happy when we follow and obey Him. (Place happy emoji on board.)









































Counting What You Gained





Materials:

- · Copy paper
- Paper plates (2)
- Brad
- Puncturing tool
- Scissors
- · Coloring pencils, crayons, markers or paint
- Craft Template A

Parent/Teacher Preparation:

Print Craft Template A on copy paper.

The Flood

Genesis 6:14 - 8:4









Instructions for the Craft:

• Cut out Craft Template A (A1 and A2 pieces). (P1)

1st Paper Plate

- Using the A1 piece, trace the shape onto the 1st paper plate, leaving a 1 1/2" border. (P2a, P2b)
- Cut out the shape. (P2c)
- Color or paint the top rim with colors of the rainbow. Remember ROY G BIV? (red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet). (P3)

Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

- Under the rainbow, along the wiggly lines, color or paint the plate green and brown to represent Mt. Ararat. (P4a, P4b)
- Below the green and brown, color or paint a blue line to represent the water. (P5b)
- Below the water line create a day-time or night-time sky using coloring medium of choice or paint. (P6-1, P6-2)
- Using blue puffy paint or coloring medium of choice, make rain drops in the sky. (P6-1, P6-2)
- Set aside 1st paper plate.

2nd Paper Plate

- Trace the ark (A2) onto the 2nd paper plate and cut it out. (P7a, P7b)
- Color or paint the ark brown. (P8-1, P8-2)
- Color or paint the bottom half of the plate blue to represent water. (P8-1, P8-2)
- If using paint, allow to dry.

Connecting the Plates

• Using a puncturing tool, poke a hole in the center of both plates and use a brad to attach them together with the ark on top. They will rotate showing the storm and the rainbow. (P9)

P8-1 This craft represents the ark during the days of flooding and constant rain as well as when it rested on Mt. Ararat and Yahweh put the rainbow in the sky as a promise to never flood the entire earth again.









Sing to the tune of "Old MacDonald"

Before starting this song give each child a stuffed animal or picture of an animal that will be used for this song. When you get to the part in the song where you say that animal's name, touch a child on the head and have him raise his animal up high and name it. Then have the whole class sing the name of the animal and make its sound. The children should also distinguish clean pairs and unclean pairs. If there are 7 pairs of clean animals, that would make 14 of that animal. If there is 1 pair of unclean animals, that would make 2 of them.

Ingredients:


- Rainbow colored cereal (such as Fruit Loops)
