TREASURING HIS WORD

Let's do a quick overview of the entire Torah portion:

Monday:	Gen. 6:9-22	Yahweh tells Noah to build an ark
Tuesday:	Gen. 7	The story of the flood
Wednesday:	Gen. 8:1-19	The flood is over
Thursday:	Gen. 8:20 - 10:32	The covenant of the rainbow; Noah's drunkenness; Genealogy of Noah's sons
Friday:	Gen. 11	The Tower of Babel; The genealogy of Shem to Abram

In this week's Parsha Pearls lesson, we will be covering the story of the flood. Now, let's read Gen. 6:5 - 9:17.

PARSHA POINTS

- In a very short period of time man became wicked and did evil in the eyes of Yahweh - 6:5
- Yahweh was sorry He had made man and He grieved in His heart - 6:6
- Yahweh decided to wipe the earth clean of all sin and disobedience - 6:7
- Noah found merited favor in Yahweh's eyes - 6:8
- Noah walked with Elohim and was called righteous (**tsaddiq**) and perfect (**tamim**) - 6:9; 7:1
- Yahweh told Noah to make an ark of gopher wood to save himself and his family - 6:14, 18
- Yahweh gave exact measurements for how He wanted the ark to be made - 6:15-16
- Yahweh tells Noah that He is making a covenant (**brit**) with him (like a marriage) - 6:18
- Clean animals are distinguished when Yahweh tells Noah to bring 7 (**sheva**) pairs of them - 7:2
- Unclean animals are distinguished when Yahweh tells Noah to bring 2 (**shtayim**) of them - 7:2
- Yahweh tells Noah that it will rain for 40 (**arba'im**) days and 40 nights - 7:4
- Noah was 600 (**shesh me'ot**) years old when the flood came - 7:6
- All flesh - man, birds, mammals, amphibians and tiny bugs died in the flood - 7:21-23
- The waters rose for 150 (**me'ah chamishim**) days, and then Elohim made a wind to pass over the earth so the waters could subside - 7:24; 8:3
- The ark rested on Mt. Ararat - 8:4



- Noah sent out (8:7-12):
 - a raven to see if it could find a place to rest
 - a dove to see if it could find a place to rest
 - the dove again after 7 days and it came back with a fresh olive leaf in its mouth
 - the dove again after 7 days and it did NOT return



- After Noah and his family and all living flesh left the ark, Noah built an altar to Yahweh and gave an offering of every clean beast and clean bird to Yahweh - 8:20
- Yahweh tells Noah (8:21-22; 9:4-17):
 - that as long as the earth remains, He would never smite the whole earth again for man's evil
 - that the blood of an animal should NOT be consumed
 - that man should NOT shed another man's blood
 - and his children to have more children so that the earth can replenish
 - that He establishes His covenant to never cut off all flesh with a flood
 - that the sign of this covenant is a rainbow (**keshet**) in the cloud



DIGGING DEEPER

Parents/Teachers may choose to use these prompts for further discussion of the Torah portion.

- What is wickedness? (6:5) Find and discuss verses to support your answer.
- What is favor? Is it merited or unmerited? (6:8) Find and discuss verses to support your answer.
- What does it mean to be righteous and perfect? Is it walking without a mistake or is it being full of integrity? (6:9)
- Were the commands about clean and unclean animals already in place before Exodus? (7:2-3)
- Discuss the time period of the flood. (7:6, 10-11, 17, 24; 8:3-6, 13-14)
- How do you think Noah knew to give an offering to Yahweh and what kind? (8:20-21)
- In Genesis 9:3, Elohim tells Noah that 'every moving creature that lives is food for you.' However, Yahweh tells him to take 7 pairs of clean animals onto the ark (7:2-3). Even though the clean foods instruction isn't mentioned until Leviticus 11, how do you think Noah knew about clean foods? (7:2-3; 9:3)
- Discuss the importance of draining blood from meats we eat. (9:4)
- Discuss the difference between murder and kill as defined in Scripture. (9:6)
- Explain what a covenant is. (9:9-11, 15-17)

NOTEBOOK PAGE

The Flood

Genesis 6:14 - 8:4

Materials:

- Cardstock - blue & white
- Copy paper
- Construction paper, scrapbook paper or colored paper - light & dark brown
- Tissue paper - blue, cut to 8½" x 11"
- Clear glitter or puffy paint (to make raindrops)
- Brads
- X-acto knife
- Glue stick
- Double-sided tape
- Scissors
- Coloring pencils, crayons or markers
- Optional: cardboard from a cereal box or similar weight
- Notebook Templates: A & B (BW) or C & D (color)



Parent/Teacher Preparation:

- Print Notebook Templates of choice on white cardstock.
- Depending on the skill of the child, you may need to cut out the Template pieces for them.

Instructions for the Notebook Page:

- If using BW Templates, color using medium of choice.
- Cut out all Template pieces. (P1)
- Label the ark pieces on the back to assist in assembling the ark.
- If using BW Template (A4), place over brown construction paper and cut out. (P2)
- Using an X-acto knife, cut along the 2 dotted lines, careful to stop where each dotted line ends. If using the BW Template, leave the template over the brown construction paper and then using an X-acto knife, puncture through both sheets along the 2 dotted lines in order to create 2 slits. Be careful to stop where each dotted line ends. (P3-1, P3-2)



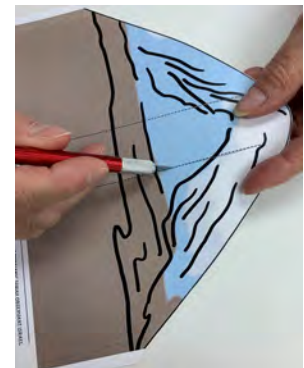

Instructions for the Notebook Page cont'd:

Creating the Ark

- Take your whole ark piece (B1) and apply glue only at the sides and bottom. Do NOT apply glue on the top (roof) or corners as we are making pockets for the character pieces to be stored in. (P4-1, P4-2)
- Place (A3) top roof piece on the whole ark and align the left and right side. Press and hold for a few minutes to allow the cardstock to adhere and set. Note that the roof piece is wider than the whole ark so as to create a storage pocket. (P5)
- Place (A2) middle piece on the whole ark and align the left and right side. Press and hold for a few minutes to allow the cardstock to adhere and set. Note that the middle piece is wider than the whole ark so as to create a storage pocket. (P6)
- Place (A1) bottom piece on the whole ark piece along the bottom and on the left and right side. Align the sides and bottom ensuring you are not going over the edge of the whole ark piece underneath. Press and hold for a few minutes to allow the cardstock to adhere and set. (P7-1, P7-2)
- Set the ark piece aside to allow to dry completely.



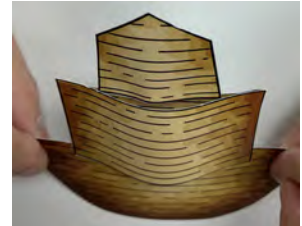

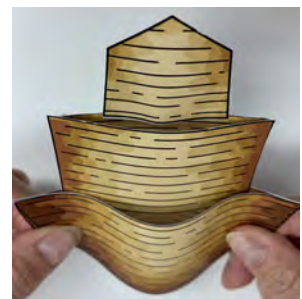

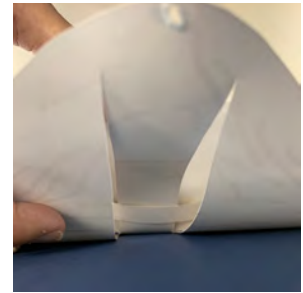
Instructions for the Notebook Page cont'd:

Mountain and Ark

- Insert the rectangle piece (B2) through the cut slits of the mountain. (P8)
- Apply glue to the sides of the rectangle piece (B2) and place your dry completed ark on top of the rectangle making sure to attach at the base of the ark. Align the top of the ark in between the 2 slits. Then hold the glued sides for a few seconds so as to prevent the ark from being glued to the mountain. Allow to dry completely before sliding the ark up and down the mountain. (P9-1, P9-2)
- Slide the ark to the top and carefully glue the bottom of the mountain to the bottom of the blue cardstock. This will seal the ark in so it can slide up and down the mountain but won't slide off. Do NOT glue the top part of the mountain to the blue cardstock as this is where the rainbow will attach and turn under the mountain to be seen or hidden.
- Fold the blue tissue paper into accordion folds to create the water that rises to the top of the mountain. (P10)
- Run double-sided tape along the bottom edge of the brown construction paper mountain or the footer of the colored Main Page mountain. Then lay one end of the accordion water piece over it. Make sure that the folds come up in the correct direction before laying down. (P11-1, P11-2, P11-3)
- Slide the ark down and spread glue stick or double-sided tape to the bottom. Attach the other end of the tissue to the adhesive. (P12-1, P12-2)
- The ark should slide up and down the mountain and the tissue accordion open up when the ark goes up and close when the ark comes down. Make sure that the tissue is totally dry and adhered to the mountain and ark before sliding them up and down. (P13a, P13b)



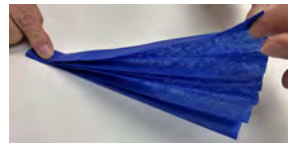

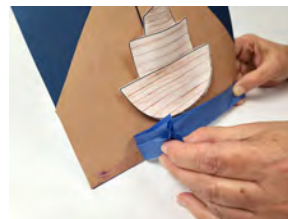

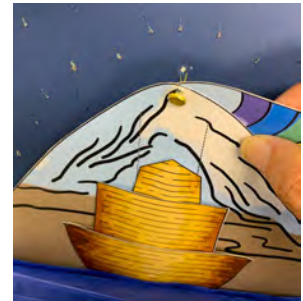
Instructions for the Notebook Page cont'd:

Adding Rainbow

- Using a puncturing tool, make a hole through the top of the mountain, the rainbow and the Main Page. (P14)
- Insert a brad through all 3 layers and open in the back to secure. (P15)
- Now the rainbow can come out from behind the mountain by rotating it up or be hidden behind the mountain by rotating it down. (P16-1, P16-2)



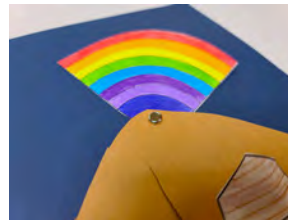

Adding Raindrops and Birds

- Using silver glitter glue or puffy paint, make rain drops in the sky. (P17)
- Allow to dry.
- Remove paper from one side of a foam dimensional and then place on the back of the birds. Remove paper from the other side and adhere the birds on the left side of the Main Page next to the top of the ark in the sky. (P18)

Adding Characters to Ark

 - Top - Noah and his wife, giraffe
 - Middle - Noah's sons and their wives
 - Bottom - elephants, bulls, cows, goats, sheep



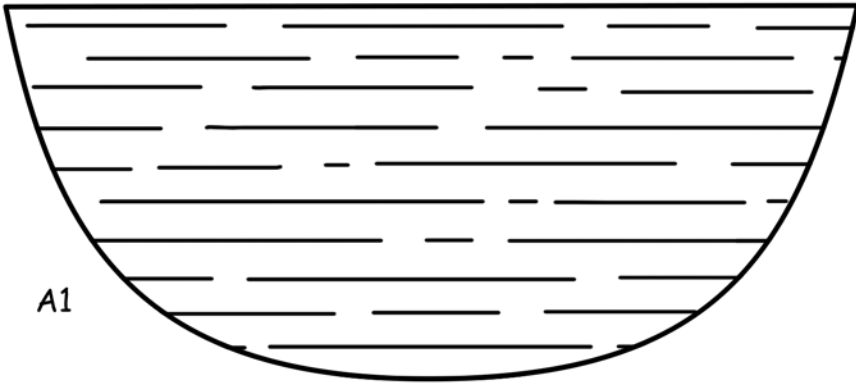

Sing to the tune of "Old MacDonald"

Before starting this song give each child a stuffed animal or picture of an animal that will be used for this song. When you get to the part in the song where you say that animal's name, touch a child on the head and have him raise his animal up high and name it. Then have the whole class sing the name of the animal and make its sound. The children should also distinguish clean pairs and unclean pairs. If there are 7 pairs of clean animals, that would make 14 of that animal. If there is 1 pair of unclean animals, that would make 2 of them.

Ingredients:

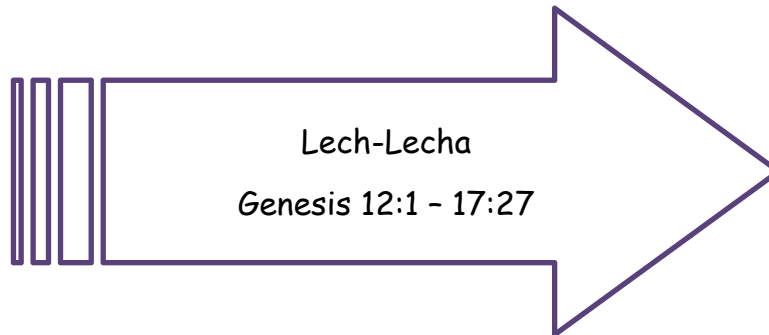
- Rainbow colored cereal (such as *Fruit Loops*)

Instructions:

This snack represents Noah's ark, the animals and the rainbow. Have the individual parts ready ahead of time so that they can be passed out easily. Allow the child to put the food in the right place to make the scene above. We used a piece of paper to create the scene on. The child can use that as the plate.
