Continual Covenants

Shalom children! Shortly after A<u>b</u>ram rescued his nephew Lot from the 4 kings who had captured him and his family, Yahweh spoke to A<u>b</u>ram in a vision. (Place younger A<u>b</u>ram on board.) He told A<u>b</u>ram that He would be his shield (place shield on board), and also that his descendants would be as many as the stars up in the sky! (Place stars on board.) A<u>b</u>ram trusted and believed Yahweh's promises, and Yahweh saw this as righteousness. (Remove shield and stars from board and place A<u>b</u>ram's blessing scene on board.)

Yahweh told A<u>b</u>ram that He was making a covenant with him and his descendants. Do you know what a covenant is? It's a contract between 2 or more parties. With Yahweh, it is an agreement in which Yahweh makes promises to His people and requires certain conduct from them. Do you remember another covenant that Yahweh made in an earlier parsha? Do you remember the covenant of the rainbow? (Place rainbow on board.)

To make an official covenant with $A\underline{b}$ ram, Yahweh asked him to bring certain offerings. Let's take a look at what they were. $A\underline{b}$ ram brought a 3-year-old heifer, a 3-year-old female goat, a 3-year-old ram, and 2 different birds: a turtledove and a young pigeon. (Place all animals on board.) In future parshas we will learn more about offerings, but for now we can see that Yahweh required $A\underline{b}$ ram to bring these sacrifices in order to receive the promises. It seems that Yahweh is always testing us and proving us, so that He knows whether it is in our hearts to obey Him.

After A<u>b</u>ram gathered these animals, he fell asleep and had a dream. In his dream he felt a scary darkness. Have you ever had a dream that made you afraid? In his dream, Yahweh let him know that his future descendants were going to be slaves to someone for 400 years. (Place slave scene on board.) However, they were also going to be delivered after this, and go out with lots of things to help them get a new start. (Place bounty scene on board.) He also told A<u>b</u>ram that he was going to live to a good old age and explained where his descendants were going to live.

(Remove all characters from board.)

When A<u>b</u>ram was 99 years old (place older A<u>b</u>ram on board), Yahweh appeared to him again and spoke to him. He reminded A<u>b</u>ram to walk before Yahweh and to be perfect in his walk. Being perfect doesn't mean you will never make mistakes. It means that you always try your best to please Yahweh, because you love Him. A<u>b</u>ram was really good at doing that, and He is a good example for us.



Yahweh reminded A<u>b</u>ram that he was going to have lots of descendants, but this time He gave him some new information. He told him that he would be a father of many different nations. **(Place nations on board.)** That includes you and me. Boy, is that ever cool!

Then Yahweh told A<u>b</u>ram that his name was going to be changed to A<u>b</u>raham because he was going to be a father of many nations. (Place A<u>b</u>raham name change scene on board.) Also, many kings were going to be in his line. (Place king on board.) Can you think of any kings in the Scriptures that would have been descendants of A<u>b</u>raham? (Allow children to answer.)

He also told A<u>b</u>raham that the land that his descendants would possess is called Kena'an. (Place Kena'an scene on board.) Even though there were other people living there (place other nations on board), Yahweh wanted his children, Yisra'el, to inherit this land so that they could all be together to worship Him.

The next thing that Yahweh wanted was for all men to be circumcised as a sign of obedience to the covenant between Him and A<u>b</u>raham's descendants. (Place circumcision scene on board.) He told them to do this to a baby boy at 8 days old.

(Remove all characters from board.)

Yahweh also changed Sarai's name. (Place Sarah name change scene on board.) From now on, she would be called Sarah, because at last she was going to have a son, and many nationalities and kings would also come from her. (Place Abraham and Sarah with nations around them scene on board.) He told Abraham that Sarah would give birth to their son Yitshaq (place Abraham and Sarah with baby Yitshaq scene on board), and that with this son, Yahweh would continue the covenant.


Because Yahweh cares about everyone, He reassured A<u>b</u>raham that his son Yishma'el would also be blessed, and would have 12 princes as his descendants. (Place Yishma'el and 12 princes scene on board.)


A<u>b</u>raham, Yishma'el, and all the men of his household who were either born to him or bought with silver were circumcised that day to show Yahweh their obedience to the covenant. (Remove all characters from board and place silver scene on board.) A<u>b</u>raham was 99 years old when he was circumcised, and Yishma'el was 13 years old. (Place older A<u>b</u>raham and Yishma'el on board.)

In this parsha, we have learned a lot about the covenants that Yahweh made with His people. Isn't it wonderful that Yahweh wants to have a relationship with us and that we can be called His children? I know this makes Him very happy. (Place happy emoji on board.)

Well children, we have come to the end of our story for today. We will see you next week for another exciting Little Gems story!














































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
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Counting What You Gained





Precious Possessions

CRAFT

Materials:

- 11" × 14" foam board or heavy duty cardboard (2)
- Aluminum foil
- Stencils
- Double-sided tape
- Glue or glue stick
- $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" piece of felt (your color of choice)
- 3" x 10" piece of felt (your color of choice)
- $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" piece of construction paper (your choice of color but light enough to write on)
- Craft paint black
- Small foam brush
- Piece of cheese cloth or sponge
- X-acto knife
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Black marker or crayon

Parent/Teacher Preparation:


Pre-cut:

- pieces of foam board for the shield
- \cdot felt for the backing and the handle
- construction paper for the banner/ribbon

Instructions for the Craft:

This shield will require 2 templates, so you will make 2 of these pieces.

- Lay the first piece of foam board portrait style 11" across the top, 14" along the sides.
- Make the following measurements: (P1)
 - A. From the top left side measure across $5\frac{1}{2}$ " and mark with a pencil (this will be the center measurement).
 - B. From the top of the board going down on the left side, measure 7" and mark with a pencil. Repeat this process on the right side of the board.
 - C. From the bottom left side measure across $4\frac{1}{2}$ " and mark with a pencil. Repeat this process on the right side.





Instructions for the Craft cont'd:

- Draw a line from B to C on the left side. Repeat on the right side. (P2)
- Draw an arc from B to C to round out the shape.
 (P2)
- Cut along the arc with an X-acto knife. (P3)
- Using the cut piece, flip it over and use it as a template to draw the arc on the other side. (P4)
- Cut the arc out with an X-acto knife. (P5)
- Draw an arc from the left side to the center point A and cut it out. (P6)
- Using the cut piece as a template, flip it over and draw the arc on the right side. (P7)
- Cut the arc out with an X-acto knife.
- Repeat the process to create a duplicate shield.

To Create the 3D Effect


- Take one shield and make the following measurements:
 - > Measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ " from all edges and mark. (P8)
 - Connect the marks and then cut out the center shape. (P9)
- Lay this cut piece over the solid piece and glue together - double-sided tape or glue stick works best here for quick dry. (P9)
- Use foil wrap to cover the shield. Lay a piece of foil with the shiny side up and put the shield face up on top of the foil, wrap the back first. (P10)
- Now lay foil shiny side down and wrap the front of the shield with any extra foil overlapping to the back (this will be covered). (P11)
- Make sure to rub foil into the groove created by the additional template, creating a 3D effect. (P10)
- Turn shield over and glue down any loose seams.



Instructions for the Craft cont'd:

To Create the Arm Band/Handle

- Lay the $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" piece of felt and trim edges to fit the shield. (P12)
- Measure 2" and again at 6" from the top of that piece of felt and cut at each measurement a 3" slit.
- Insert one end of the 3" x 10" piece of felt into the top slit and the other end into the second slit. (P13)
- Turn over the large piece of felt and secure the handle. (P13)
- Now glue the larger piece of felt onto the back of your shield - let dry. (P14)

To Create an 'Aged' Look

 Using black craft paint, dip a piece of cheese cloth into the paint and sponge/stamp the front only to age the shield - let dry. (P15)

To Create the Banner

- Fold an $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" of construction paper in half and cut. This will create 2 pieces 11" long. (P16)
- Cut one of the 11" long pieces in half. (P16)
- Cut the end of one side of each small piece to create a ribbon edge. (P17)
- Fold each end of the 11' long piece by one. This will create the center portion of the banner. (P18)
- Using stencils or a free hand, write 'YAHWEH' on this center portion with black paint, marker or crayon. (P18)
- Using a foam brush with black paint or crayons, add shading to the banner to create depth and age. (P18)
- Start with gluing the 2 small pieces to your shield. (P19)
- Place glue on the center of the larger piece of the banner so that it sticks to the center of the shield leaving the 2 ends to sit on top of the other pieces. This will make the banner look like it is flowing. (P20)





SWEET TASTE OF TORAH

This snack relates to this week's parsha. Please take these as suggestions and make necessary changes based on your individual dietary needs.

Star Cookies

Genesis 15:5



Ingredients:

- $1\frac{1}{4}$ c. all-purpose flour
- 🗄 c. sugar
- ¹/₂ c. (1 stick) butter, softened
- 4 oz. cream cheese, room temperature
- $\frac{1}{4}$ c. powdered sugar
- 24 strawberries, thinly sliced
- 1 c. blueberries

Instructions:


Preheat oven to 325° F. In a medium bowl, combine the flour and sugar. Using a pastry cutter or 2 knives, cut in the butter until mixture resembles fine crumbs and starts to cling. Form the mixture into 3 small balls and knead each one until smooth. On a lightly floured surface, roll a ball of dough to $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch thick. Use a star cookie cutter to cut into stars. Place them 1-inch apart on ungreased cookie sheets. Repeat with remaining dough. Bake for 8-10 minutes until cookies are set. Let cool on cookie sheet for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

In a small bowl, blend the cream cheese and powdered sugar with an electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Carefully spread icing evenly over each cooled cookie. Slice each strawberry slice in half and arrange on the cookies pointing outward. Place 3 blueberries in the center of each cookie.
