TREASURING HIS WORD

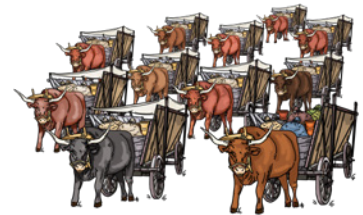
Let's do a quick overview of the entire Torah portion:

Monday:	Gen. 44:18-34	Yehudah offers to take Binyamin's place
Tuesday:	Gen. 45:1-15	Yoseph reveals himself to his brothers
Wednesday:	Gen. 45:16-28	Yoseph sends for his family
Thursday:	Gen. 46:1 - 47:12	Elohim speaks to Ya'aqob; Yoseph's family arrives in Mitsrayim and settles in
Friday:	Gen. 47:13-27	Yoseph buys entire land of Mitsrayim for Pharaoh

After Yoseph was promoted to 2nd in command under Pharaoh, his brothers also came to Mitsrayim to buy grain. Yoseph played some tricks on his brothers to test their love for their brother Binyamin. After they passed Yoseph's tests, he revealed to them who he was and made peace with them. In this week's Parsha Pearls lesson, the report of Yoseph and his brothers' reunion has reached Pharaoh. We will witness the gifts that Pharaoh graciously bestows upon Yoseph's family as he directs Yoseph to bring his entire family to Mitsrayim. Now, let's read Gen. 45:16-28; 46 & 47:1-12, 27.

PARSHA POINTS

- Pharaoh and his servants were glad to hear about Yoseph's reunion with his brothers - 45:16
- Pharaoh told Yoseph (45:17-20):
 - "Have your brothers load their animals and go back to Kena'an"
 - "Bring your father and your households here"
 - "I will give your family the best land of Mitsrayim to live in"
 - "You won't go hungry"
 - "Take my wagons and go get your entire family"
 - "Whatever you had there, will be replaced with better things here"
- Pharaoh provided (45:21-23):
 - Yoseph's brothers with wagons and food for their journey (**derek**) as well as changes of garments (**semalot**)
 - Binyamin a wagon (**agalah**) with 300 (**shlosh me'ot**) pieces of silver and 5 (**chamesh**) changes of garments
 - Yoseph's father with 10 (**eser**) donkeys (**chamorim**) loaded with gifts and 10 female donkeys loaded with grain, bread and food for his journey



- Yoseph sent his brothers with an admonishment NOT to quarrel among themselves - 45:24
- Yoseph's brothers told Ya'aqob that Yoseph was still alive and governor of Mitsrayim. Ya'aqob's heart stopped when he heard the news - 45:26
- After Ya'aqob saw all the things that Pharaoh had provided, he believed his sons and exclaimed that he wanted to see Yoseph before he died - 45:27-28
- On his way to Mitsrayim, Ya'aqob gave offerings to Elohim in Be'ersheba. Elohim spoke to Ya'aqob in visions, reassuring him that He would be with him and make him a great nation - 46:1-4
- All Ya'aqob's household headed for Mitsrayim, 66 (**shishim ve shesh**) beings in all - 46:5-26
- Ya'aqob sent Yehudah ahead to point the way to Goshen. When they arrived, Yoseph came out to meet them - 46:28-29
- Yoseph had an emotional reunion with his father, with big hugs and many tears - 46:29
- Yisra'el declared that he could now die in peace, because he had seen Yoseph again - 46:30
- Yoseph advised his brothers that when Pharaoh asked their occupation that they should answer that they were herdsmen over the livestock instead of referring to themselves as shepherds, because they were considered to be an abomination to the Mitsrites - 46:31-34
- Yoseph and Pharaoh confirmed that his family would dwell in Goshen which had the best land in Mitsrayim. The most skilled among them were also appointed as chief herdsmen over Pharaoh's livestock - 47:1-6
- Ya'aqob was presented before Pharaoh and blessed Pharaoh - 47:7, 10
- Yoseph provided bread for his father and his brothers during the time of scarcity - 47:12-13
- Yoseph's family prospered in the land of Goshen - 47:27



DIGGING DEEPER

Parents/Teachers may choose to use these prompts for further discussion of the Torah portion.

- Notice that Yoseph openly showed favor to Binyamin by giving him 300 pieces of silver and 5 changes of garments. In the same way, when Yoseph was first reunited with them at the feast, he gave Binyamin 5X as much as he gave to his other brothers at the feast (43:34); how do you think the brothers felt about that? (45:22)
- Ya'aqob did NOT believe his children when they said that Yoseph was alive, until the wagons came with all the provisions from Mitsrayim. Research the significance of the Hebrew word for wagon, and why this might have been the reason Ya'aqob believed his son was now alive. (45:26-28)
- Why do you think shepherds were an abomination to the Mitsrites? Why do you think Yoseph's brothers told Pharaoh they were shepherds even after Yoseph told them NOT to? Were they showing Yoseph and Pharaoh their sovereignty? (46:33-34; 47:3)
- Is there a significance to Yoseph sending 5 of his family members to meet with Pharaoh? What does the number 5 represent in the Scriptures? (47:2)
- Why did Pharaoh provide Yoseph's family with the best land in Mitsrayim? Why did Pharaoh offer Yoseph's brothers the job of 'chief herdsman'? Was it because in actuality they were more than common shepherds but understood shepherding to a greater degree? (47:6)
- Why do you think Ya'aqob blessed Pharaoh? Was it because he was honoring him or thanking him? Was he showing Pharaoh that he also had authority? (47:7, 10)
- Discuss the significance of Yoseph providing his family with bread when there was none to be found in Mitsrayim. (47:12-13)

- Cardstock - white
- Craft sticks - regular
- Silver sequins (for sack)
- Foam dimensional
- Hot glue
- Tacky glue
- Scissors
- Coloring pencils, crayons or markers
- Optional: Glitter glue & gems for garments and wagon, buttons and toothpicks for wheels
- Notebook Templates: Main Page, A & B (BW) or Main Page, C & D (color)

Parent/Teacher Preparation:

- Print Notebook Templates of choice on white cardstock.

Instructions for the Notebook Page:

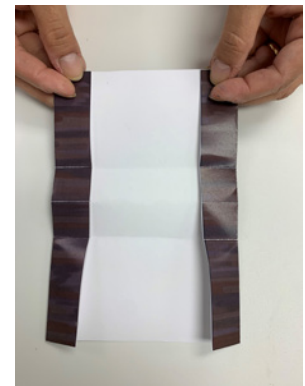
- If using BW Templates, color using medium of choice.
- Cut out all Template pieces. For the wagon and rectangles, cut only on the solid lines. Do NOT cut on dotted lines as these are fold lines. (P1)

To Fold the Paper Wagon

- Fold the long flaps in along the dotted lines. (P2)
- Pinch or fold the center dotted line up so that you have a 'w' shape. (P3)
- Fold the 2 outer middle lines up so that you have a standing 'w' shape on your wagon. (P4)



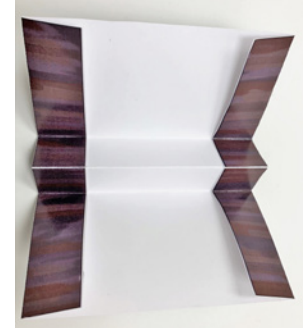

Instructions for the Notebook Page cont'd:

To Create the 3-D Wagon

- Take 2 rectangles and accordion fold them to make a 'w'. (P5)
- Add Tacky glue to one of the square ends of your rectangle and attach to inside fold of the wagon. (P6a, P6b)
- Repeat this process on the other side as well as the other end of the wagon. (P7a, P7b)

Attaching the Wagon

- Add Tacky glue to the rectangle on the Main Page. Place one side of the wagon onto the glue and allow to dry. (P8)

Attaching the Donkey

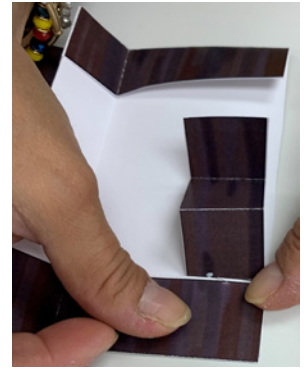
- Accordion fold the 3rd rectangle to make a 'w' shape. (P9)
- Add Tacky glue to one square on the end of the rectangle and adhere to belly of donkey on Main Page. (P10)
- Add Tacky glue to the square on the other end of the rectangle and adhere cut out donkey to the square. (P11a, P11b)
- Using hot glue, attach one end of the popsicle stick to the back side of the wagon and the other end to the back of the donkey. (P12a, P12b)

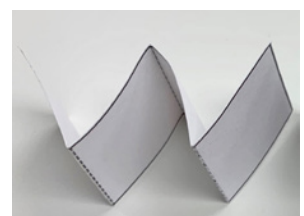

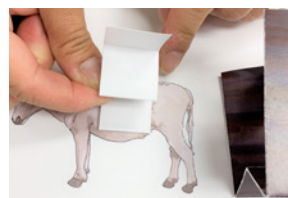

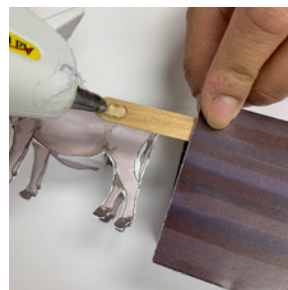

Instructions for the Notebook Page cont'd:

Assembling the Wheels

- Place hot glue on dimensionals and attach to back of both wheels. (P13)
- Hot glue wheels to bottom of wagon. Allow to dry. (P14)
 - If desired use buttons for the wheels instead of templates provided. You can also break off some toothpicks to add dimension to the spokes on the wheels.

Silver Bag and Garments

- Add Tacky glue to silver bag and place sequins on silver to add dimension. Allow to dry. (P15)
- Place the 5 garments inside the wagon along with the sack of silver representing the 300 pieces of silver that Binyamin was given. (P16)
 - You can also trace the garments onto fabric and cut them out if you desire.
 - You can also decorate the garments or wagon as desired using glitter glue, ribbons, gems or any other items you have.

SWEET TASTE OF TORAH

This snack relates to this week's parsha. Please take these as suggestions and make necessary changes based on your individual dietary needs.

3-D Wagon

Genesis 45:19, 21, 27

Ingredients:

- *Graham* crackers (to make wagon)
- Pretzel dipping sticks (2) - (to hold wheels)
- Marshmallow fluff (for adhesive)
- *Keebler Fudge Stripes* cookies (4) - (represents wheels)

Instructions:

* Note: Making this wagon is a bit hard without extra helping hands. A 1-dimensional version in sweet and savory is also provided.

- Attach cookie 'wheels' to both ends of 2 pretzel dipping sticks.
- Place some marshmallow fluff on a plate where the wagon wheels will be placed to keep them from moving.
- Lay 1 *Graham* cracker over the pretzel sticks between the 'wheels'.
- Break a *Graham* cracker in half lengthwise to make a rectangle. Place one of the halves against the 'wheels' on one side and the other half against the 'wheels' on the other side using marshmallow fluff as adhesive. You now have the sides of the wagon.
- Break a *Graham* cracker in half widthwise to make a square. Lay one piece on the end of the wagon using marshmallow fluff as adhesive. Lay the other square on the other side closing up the wagon. Use marshmallow fluff as adhesive.
- Your wagon is now complete.

* If making this wagon 1 dimensional do the following:

For a sweet version: (P1)

Place 1 *Graham* cracker on a plate.
Place 2 *Keebler Fudge Stripe* cookies along the bottom edge to represent the wagon wheels.

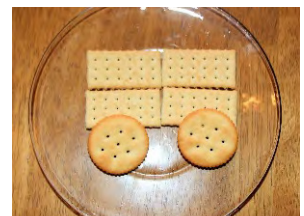
* Children can use colored gels or frosting, marshmallow fluff and sprinkles to decorate wagon if they choose to.

For a savory version: (P2)

Place 4 *Saltine* crackers on a plate to make a rectangle.
Place 2 *Ritz* crackers along the bottom edge to represent the wagon wheels.



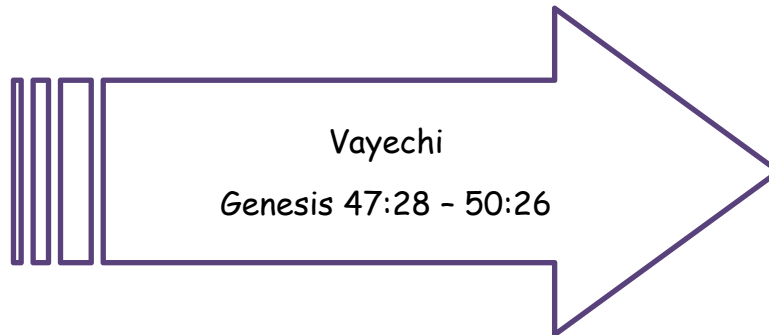
