

LITTLE GEMS STORY

Am I Dreaming?

Shalom children! A lot happened in our last lesson. Two brothers were born to Yitshaq and Ribqah - twins named Esaw and Ya'aqob. **(Place Esaw and Ya'aqob on board.)** They grew up having very different interests, and Ya'aqob ended up tricking Esaw out of 2 things. Do you remember what they were? **(Allow children to answer.)** That's right, he tricked him out of his birthright when he was hungry, and then out of his blessing while he was hunting. Now, Esaw may have let it go the first time, but when Ya'aqob took something from him the second time, that was it. He was so mad that he threatened to kill Ya'aqob. **(Place angry emoji on board.)** His parents were afraid for him **(place scared emoji on board)**, so they sent him to stay with Ribqah's brother Laban.

(Remove all characters from board except for Ya'aqob. Place sun on board.)

Ya'aqob left quickly, and he probably didn't have much with him. As the sun started setting, he stopped to rest and grabbed a stone to use for a pillow. **(Replace sun with moon.)** As he slept, he had a dream. He saw a ladder that went all the way into the clouds, and there were messengers going up and down the ladder. **(Place ladder dream scene on board.)** Ya'aqob heard a voice coming from way above the ladder. It was Yahweh. **(Place messenger above ladder dream scene.)** He talked to Ya'aqob, just as He did with his father Yitshaq and his grandfather Abraham. **(Place Yitshaq and Abraham on board.)** Yahweh gave him the same promises He had given to them. He would bless him and guard him and keep him safe, and Yahweh would give him the land where he was lying. Ya'aqob woke up feeling a little scared. He realized that the place where he had stopped to sleep was set-apart.

(Remove all characters from board and place Ya'aqob and sun on board.)

Ya'aqob got up early the next morning. He took the stone from under his head and stood it up. **(Place stone in vertical position on board.)** To thank Yahweh for taking care of him on his journey by providing him with bread to eat and a garment to wear, Ya'aqob then made a vow which is like a promise to Yahweh. **(Place robe and bread on board.)**

He vowed that if Yahweh would be with him and bring him safely back to his father's home in peace, he would return to this spot and give back to Yahweh a tenth of all Yahweh had given him. Ya'aqob also changed the name of the place where he had stopped to rest. He called it Beyth El, which means 'House of El'. He said that this place would be Elohim's house.



Children, do you remember who else gave a tenth in a previous parsha lesson? **(Allow children to answer.)** Abraham gave a tenth of what he had to King Malkitsedeq of Shalem after he had rescued Lot from the battle of the 4 kings against the 5 unfaithful kings. **(Place Malkitsedeq on board next to Abraham.)**

(Place 9 baskets and single basket next to each other on board.)

Children, can you help me count to 10 and set aside 1 part for Yahweh? **(Count 9 baskets with children and separate single basket.)** That's great, children! Let's always remember to put Yahweh first so that He can bless us, guard us, and keep us safe!

Well children, we have come to the end of our story for today. We will see you next week for another exciting Little Gems story!



The Ladder Dream

Genesis 28:11-12

Materials:

- Cardstock - white
- Glitter glue - purple
- Ruler
- Double-sided adhesive foam dimensionals
- Double-sided adhesive tape
- Scissors
- Coloring pencils, crayons or markers
- Craft Templates: Main Page & A (BW) or Main Page & B (color)

Parent/Teacher Preparation:

- Print Craft Templates of choice on white cardstock.



Instructions for the Craft:

- If using BW Templates, color using medium of choice.
- Cut out all Template pieces. (P1)
- Using purple glitter glue, add dimension to the single cloud and the ones on the Main Page. (P2a, P2b)
- Using a ruler, fold the Main Page and ladder outward at the solid lines. (P3a, P3b)
- Run double-sided adhesive tape onto the rectangle boxes on the Main Page. (P4a, P4b)

Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

- Connect the folded tabs on the ladder to the rectangles on the Main Page. (P5a, P5b)
- Adhere small round double-sided adhesive foam dimensionals to the single cloud and the messengers. (P6)
- Place the single cloud at the top of the ladder and the messenger on the steps. (P7a, P7b)


Assembling Ya'aqob

- Using a ruler, make folds on all the solid lines of the sleeping Ya'aqob box. (P8a, P8b)
- Run double-sided adhesive tape on the bottom fold. (P9a, P9b)
- Start folding all the lines to make a box. (P10)
- Then close the box by adhering the back of Ya'aqob to the tape. (P11a, P11b)
- Run double-sided adhesive tape on the bottom of sleeping Ya'aqob and place him on the Main Page. (P12)

You now have a visual representation of Ya'aqob's dream as he saw messengers going up and down the ladder.

CRAFT

Materials:

- Copy paper
- $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon (2 litre) carton of milk or juice, clean and empty
- Brown paper grocery bag
- Dimensional paint - gold or yellow
- Glue stick or glue
- Scissors
- Pen or pencil
- Coloring pencils, crayons or markers
- Craft Templates: A (BW) or B (color)

Standing Column Tzedakah Box

Genesis 28:22



Parent/Teacher Preparation:

- Print Craft Template of choice on copy paper.
- Depending on the skill of the child, you may need to help them with the flaps.

Instructions for the Craft:

- If using BW Template, color using medium of choice.
- Cut out Craft Template. (P1)

Creating the Flat Top

- Pull the top of the carton so that the upper part is completely open. Do NOT tear it or cut it off as it will be needed to create the flat top. (P2)
- On 2 sides of the top it is shaped like a triangle. Cut along the lines so that there are 2 flaps that are triangular and 2 flaps with 2 small triangles attached to them. (P3a, P3b, P4a, P4b)

Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

- Pull all flaps away from center to enable working with each flap one at a time. (P5)
- Cut the excess cardboard at the top of the box. (P6a, P6b)
- Pull all flaps out. (P7)
- Push the back flap and 2 small triangles into the carton. (P8a)
- Push the front flap and 2 small triangles into the carton to close up the top. (P8b)
- Fold the 2 larger triangles over the top of the carton meeting the edges behind the spout. (P9)
- Using a piece of packing tape, seal the top. (P10a, P10b)
- Stick your finger in the pour spout to raise any sunken flaps and adhere to the packing tape. The top is now closed.
 - If a flap is in the way of the pour spout, using a pen or marker, mark where it overlaps through the pour spout.
 - Pull the flap back out of the way and cut the marked area.





Adding the Paper Bag

- Cut down the side of the paper bag to lay it out flat.
- Lay the carton on its side, on top of the paper bag, close to the edge. If there is print on the bag, use that side to trace the lines so that it does NOT show. Trace a line down both sides of the carton onto the paper bag. (P11a)
- Without lifting the carton, turn the carton to the next side and trace a line down the edge. Repeat this process until there are 5 lines on the paper bag. (P11b)
- Draw a line about 1/2" from the 1st and last line. (P12a, P12b)



Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

- Draw a line about 1" from the top and bottom where the lines begin and end. (P13)
- Connect the lines to make a rectangle around the 5 carton lines. (P14)
- Cut out the rectangle and save the excess paper bag to cover the top of the carton. (P15)
- Place a piece of the excess paper bag on the bottom of the carton and using a ruler, draw lines around the 4 edges the width of the ruler. (P16)
- Cut around the lines and place the paper bag piece of the top of the carton where the spout is. (P17a, P17b)
- Crease the edges down so that you have a triangle flap. (P18a)
- Cut the triangle flaps. (P18b)

Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

- When you are done you will have a + sign. (P19)
- Fold the edges down over the carton. (P20a)
- Using a piece of packing tape, adhere the paper bag to the carton.

- Now crumple up the rectangle brown paper bag that you made the 5 lines on. (P21)
- Place hot glue on one side of the carton and start rolling the paper over it to adhere. (P22a, P22b)

- Roll the carton and repeat this process until all sides are covered with the paper bag. (P22c, P22d)
- You should have excess at the bottom of the carton.
- Fold the paper bag over the bottom and use hot glue to adhere. (P23)

Adding the Stone Face and Oil

- Glue the Template to the front of the carton where the spout is. (P24)
- Using gold glitter glue, draw squiggly lines on the front, sides, back and top of the carton to represent the oil that Ya'aqob poured over the standing column. (P25a, P25b)
- Allow to dry.






You now have a visual representation of a standing column which can be used as a tzedakah box (bank) where a tithe or offering can be stored.

SWEET TASTE OF TORAH

This snack relates to this week's parsha. Please take these as suggestions and make necessary changes based on your individual dietary needs.

Ya'aqob's Dream

Genesis 28:12



Ingredients:

- Yogurt or cream cheese (represents clouds)
- Fresh pineapple or cheese (represents ladder)
- 1 carrot (represents Ya'aqob)
- Turkey slice / tortilla wrap (represents stone pillow)

Instructions:

Slice a fresh pineapple or cheese into thin sections about 1" wide, and lay onto plate, to look like a diagonal staircase. Next, spoon yogurt or cream cheese onto the plate to make the cloud.

Take a carrot and cut a piece about the length of a baby carrot - 3" to make the body. Cut off a circle for the face and make 2 legs by cutting the carrot slice that is about 1½" in half. Lay a folded turkey slice or tortilla wrap under Ya'aqob's head.
