## 10 Plagues Wheel

Exodus 7:15 -9:26

### Special Note:

We have provided 2 crafts depicting the plagues since the first 7 plagues are covered in parsha Va'eira and the last 3 plagues are covered in parsha Bo. You can choose to do this craft or the one found in next week's Torah portion Bo.

You can also choose to do the first 7 plagues this week and complete it next week or do the alternate craft found in next week's Torah portion Bo over 2 weeks giving you 2 years of crafts.



## Materials:

- Cardstock - white
- Brad
- Scissors
- Coloring pencils, crayons or markers
- Craft Templates: A & B (BW) or C & D (color)

### Parent/Teacher Preparation:

- Print Craft Templates A & B or C & D on white cardstock.

## Instructions for the Craft:

### Parsha Va'era

- If using BW Templates, color using medium of choice.
- You can choose to color all the plagues or just the first 7 (א, ב, ג, ד, ה, ו, ז) on Craft Template B as they relate to this week's parsha and save the last 3 for next week's parsha Bo.
- Cut out Templates A & B or C & D. (P1)
- Cut out pie slice shape on cover. (P2)
- Using a puncturing tool, poke a hole through the + sign on Craft Template A or C (cover) and the center of Craft Template B or D (plagues). (P3)
- Push a brad through the holes and open legs on the back side. (P4)





## Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

### Parsha Bo

- Disassemble the wheel and color the last 3 plagues ( **נ**, **ו**, **ז** ) on Craft Template B or D.
- Reassemble the wheel.

This may be a good time to review the plagues or maybe play a game to see if they can name the plagues before they are uncovered.

- The plagues become visible one at a time as the cover is turned. (P5-P14)

*You now have a visual representation of the 10 plagues of Mitsrayim along with the protection Yahweh bestowed on the land of Goshen where the Yisra'elites dwelt for the last 7 plagues.*


