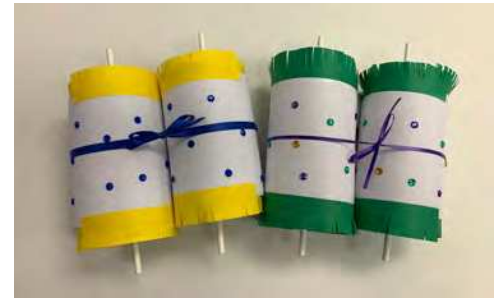


CRAFT

Torah Scrolls

Materials:

- Copy paper - white
- Copy paper (1) - color of choice
- Pringles cans - Grab and Go 1.3 oz. (2)
- Implement to make holes in bottom of can and lid the diameter of the dowel
- Dowels (2)
- Adhesive gems or embellishments of choice (for scrolls)
- Thin ribbon (to tie scrolls)
- Tweezers (to assist in placing gems)
- Clear tape
- Double-sided tape
- Glue
- Scissors
- Coloring pencils, crayons, or markers
- Craft Templates: Crowns (BW) or Crowns 1 or 2 (color)



Parent/Teacher Preparation:

- Print Templates of choice on white copy paper.
- Prep the cans ahead of time.

Assembling the Cans

- Make a hole in each can in the center at the bottom using implement of choice. (P1a, P1b)
- Make a hole in each lid using implement of choice. (P2)
- Insert dowel into the bottom of the can first and then through the lid. (P3)

Instructions for the Craft:

- If using BW Template, color using medium of choice.
- Cut out Template of choice. (P4)
- Cut out 2 sheets of copy paper the same length and width as the Template. (P5)

Instructions for the Craft cont'd:

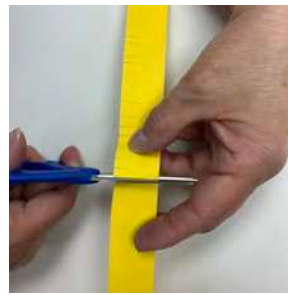
Creating the Fringe

*Please note that we made 2 crafts depicting a crown for the boys and a crown for the girls.

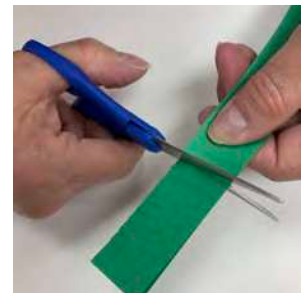
- Using a sheet of colored copy paper of choice, cut out 4 pieces about $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide.
- Using scissors, cut slits on one end about half way up. (P6a, P6b)
- You should have 4 pieces. (P6c, P6d)

Creating the Scroll

- Take your 2 plain sheets of copy paper and attach them to the back of the Crown sheet using clear tape. (P7)
- Using double-sided tape, place along the edge of the top and bottom of each plain sheet on the back side. (P8)
- Take your fringe and lay the uncut part over the double-sided tape. (P9a, P9b, P9c)
- Your scroll can now be rolled in to close or out to reveal the crown. (P10a, P10b)

Instructions for the Craft cont'd:

Decorating the Scroll

- Using adhesive gems or embellishments of choice, add to the plain sheets of the scroll. (P11)
- Be creative as you like! (P12a, P12b)
- To finish, tie a ribbon color of choice to your scrolls to keep them together. (P13a, P13b)

You now have a visual of the Word of Elohim as a beautiful keepsake to remind you of the giving of the Torah on Mt. Sinai on Shavuot.
