BEMIDBAR OVERVIEW

'In the wilderness'...Bemidbar

Today we are starting the 4th book of the Torah, called Bemi<u>d</u>bar, meaning 'In the wilderness.' The English name for this book is different from the Hebrew. It is called Numbers, because the book starts off with Yahweh commanding Mosheh and Aharon to take a census of the children of Yisra'el.

We ended the book of Vayikra (Leviticus) with Yahweh telling the children of Yisra'el all the blessings that they will receive in the land if they obey Him, and all the curses that they will suffer in the land if they disobey.

Because each parsha is so rich in information, we will only be able to examine certain parts of each parsha per lesson. We do encourage parents and their children to do their own studies. In future years, we plan to fill in the pieces from each parsha that we did not cover previously.

The book of Bemidbar starts off in the 1st day of the 1st month of the 2nd year that the children of Yisra'el have spent in the Wilderness of Sinai. Yahweh wants a census of the children of Yisra'el, and also of the Lewites. We will also learn about the special duties of the Lewite clans of Gershon, Merari and Qehath, which they are to perform for the Dwelling Place. We will learn about the cloud that covered the Dwelling Place and how its movements led the children of Yisra'el, under their tribal banners, to the Wilderness of Paran. We will see what happens when the spies return with their reports after scouting out the land. Along the way we will witness some rebellions, such as the one led by Qorah, as well as travel to the Wilderness of Tsin and learn what happens when Mosheh and Aharon disobey Yahweh. We will study a famous story about a talking donkey and learn that Yisra'el is forever blessed by Yahweh. Yahweh will command a fresh census of the next generation as their armies prepare to go into Kena'an. The book concludes with the instruction regarding distribution of the land to each tribe, and Yahweh's right-rulings for women who have neither father nor brother to take care of them.

- Nasso (Lift or Take up) Ch. 4-7
- Beha'alotcha (When you ascend or When you set up) Ch. 8-12
- Shelach (You send) Ch. 13-15
- Korach (Baldness or Qorah) Ch. 16-18
- Chukat (Laws or Statutes) Ch. 19-21
- Balak (Balag) Ch. 22-25
- Pinchas (Devastator) Ch. 25-29
- Matot (Tribes) Ch. 30-32
- Massei (Journeys) Ch. 33-36

We pray that you will be blessed as we begin our study in the 4^{th} book of the Torah. Let's dig in!

Census in the Wilderness

Shalom children! This week will be our 1st week in the book of Bemidbar. Bemidbar is a Hebrew word meaning 'in the desert' or 'in the wilderness,' but it is also the title of one of the books in the Torah. You may have also heard it called the book of Numbers.

The Yisra'elites had now reached the Wilderness of Sinai. Yahweh told Mosheh that they needed to take a census of all the men who were 20 years old and up. A census is when a group gets counted so that they can know how many people there are. Mosheh did what Yahweh said. He counted the Yisra'elites according to which family group, or tribe, they were in. These were the men who would be going out to serve in the army.

(Place each tribe with their banner along the top of the board as you read.)

The tribe of Re'uben had 46,500 men.

The tribe of Shim'on had 59,300 men.

The tribe of Gad had 45,650 men.

The tribe of Yehu<u>d</u>ah had 74,600 men.

The tribe of Yissas<u>k</u>ar had 54,400 men.

The tribe of Zebulun had 57,400 men.

(Place Yoseph without banner on board.)

The tribe of Ephrayim, which was part of Yoseph, had 40,500 men.

(Place Ephrayim on board next to Yoseph.)

The tribe of Menashsheh, which was also part of Yoseph, had 32,200 men.

(Place Menashsheh on board next to Yoseph.)

The tribe of Binyamin had 35,400 men.

The tribe of Dan had 62,700 men.

The tribe of Asher had 41,500 men.

And the tribe of Naphtali had 53,400 men.

Altogether, there were 603,550 men who were counted. That's a lot of people - over half a million! But remember, only the men were counted in this census, so if you add in all the women and children, there were actually a lot more Yisra'elites than that.

Children, do you think there were over 1 million people? I think so too.



Now, you may have noticed that the tribe of Lewi was not on this list. (Place Lewi on board.) That's not because Mosheh forgot about them. Yahweh had special plans for the Lewites, so He did not want them to be included in this census. Their job was to watch over the Dwelling Place of the Witness. They would be taking care of all its furnishings. We will talk more about that next week. When it was time for Yisra'el to move to a new location, they would also take everything down and set it all back up again. This was a job that Yahweh wanted only the Lewites to do. In fact, anybody else who came near the Dwelling Place would not live, so it was very important that each person do the job that Yahweh had told him specifically to do. Since nobody else could come near the Dwelling Place, the Lewites were given the job of helping Aharon and his sons. (Place Aharon, El'azar and Ithamar on board.) All of Yisra'el's firstborn were to be set-apart to Yahweh, but Yahweh picked the Lewites to do this job instead of the firstborn.

The Lewites were to camp more closely around the Dwelling Place, and the rest of the Yisra'elites were to set up their camps around them. (Place Dwelling Place in center of board.) Wherever each tribe set up their camp, they would display their own banner.

Yehu<u>d</u>ah, Yissas<u>k</u>ar, and Ze<u>b</u>ulun camped on the east side. (Move 3 tribes and banners to the right of the Dwelling Place.) Re'u<u>b</u>en, Shim'on, and Ga<u>d</u> camped on the south side. (Move tribes and banners below the Dwelling Place.) Ephrayim, Menashsheh, and Binyamin camped on the west side. (Move tribes and banners to the left of the Dwelling Place.) And Dan, Asher, and Naphtali camped on the north side. (Place tribes and banners above the Dwelling Place.) Whenever they moved to a different place, the group camping with Yehu<u>d</u>ah would be the 1st ones to leave. They would be followed by the group camping with Re'u<u>b</u>en; then would come the Lewites and the Tent of Meeting, traveling in the middle. They were followed by the group with Ephrayim, and finally the group with Dan.

Yahweh then told Mosheh that it was time to count all the children of Lewi. Everyone else had been counted, so now it was their turn! They were to count every man and every boy who was a month old and up. Lewi's sons were named Gershon, Qehath, and Merari. (Place 3 sons of Lewi on board.) The Gershonites were to camp to the west, behind the Dwelling place. (Place Gershonites between Dwelling Place and camp of **Ephrayim.)** They were responsible for the tent and its covering, the door covering, the courtyard screens, the door covering of the courtyard around the Dwelling Place and the altar, and all their cords. The Qehathites were to camp on the south side of the Dwelling Place. (Place Qehathites between Dwelling Place and camp of Re'uben.) They were responsible for the ark, the table, the lampstand, the altars, the utensils, and the covering. The Merarites were to camp on the north side of the Dwelling Place. (Place Merarites between Dwelling Place and camp of Dan.) They were responsible for the boards, the bars, columns, sockets, and utensils. They were also to take care of the columns, sockets, pegs, and cords of the courtyard. Last but definitely not least, Mosheh, Aharon, and his sons were to camp on the east side before the Dwelling Place. (Place Mosheh, Aharon, and sons between Dwelling Place and camp of Yehudah.) They were responsible for guarding the duty of the set-apart place and the duty of the children of Yisra'el. When Mosheh finished counting the boys and men of the Lewites, there was a total of 22,000.



Next, it was time to count all the firstborn boys of Yisra'el who were a month old and up. Now remember, Yahweh took the Lewites for Himself instead of the firstborn of Yisra'el, but He still wanted all the firstborn to be counted. Well, there were 22,273 of them, and that was 273 more than the number of Lewite boys. So for each of the additional 273 firstborn boys, 5 sheqels of silver were given to Aharon and his sons. (Place silver coins next to Aharon.)

Whew, that was a lot of counting! But now, I think things will be a lot more orderly for the Yisra'elites, because now they know who camps where, in Yahweh's perfect order.

Well children, we have come to the end of our story for today. We will see you next week for another exciting Little Gems story!



















Instructions for the Craft:

- If using BW Templates, color tribes, banners and courtyard using coloring medium of choice.
- Cut out all Template pieces. (P1)

Banners

- Lay one end of a toothpick onto the back of the banners where the poles are supposed to attach and place a small piece of tape over each toothpick to secure the poles. (P2)
- If desired, use a brown sharple to color each toothpick. (P3a, P3b)

Tribes

 Using a ruler for assistance, fold the white tabs inward on each tribe grouping. (P4a, P4b)

Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

Attaching Banners to Tribes


 Line up direction banners under the correct tribe groupings as follows: (P5)

> East side: Yissaskar, Yehudah, Zebulun

> West side: Binyamin, Ephrayim,

Menashsheh

Asher, Dan, Naphtali > North side: > South side: Gad, Re'uben, Shim'on



 Stand up tribes and banners and set aside. (P7)

Folding the Courtyard

- Using a ruler for assistance, fold the white tabs inward along the edge of the courtyard. (P8)
- Using a ruler for assistance, fold the dotted horizontal line down the middle. (P9)
- Fold all dotted lines of the courtyard sides inward toward floor of courtyard allowing for white tabs to go underneath the floor. (P10)
- Run double-sided adhesive tape onto the back of all the white tabs. (P11)

Assembling the Courtyard

- Beginning with the East side of the courtyard with the gate door, lay the white tab under the courtyard. (P12)
- Then lay the North side tab under the courtyard. (P13)
- When you flip the courtyard upside down, you should have 3 tabs connected. (P14)
- To complete the construction of the courtyard, insert the tab on the side in between the screens. (P15)
- Fold the last bottom tab onto the back of the courtyard floor. (P16)
- Your 3-D courtyard is now complete and ready to be added to the Main Page. (P17)





Attaching Tribes with Banners and Courtyard to Main Page

- Run double-sided adhesive tape onto the Main Page courtyard template. (P18)
- Place 3-D courtyard onto the tape. (P19)
- Run double-sided adhesive tape onto the front of all the white tabs of the 4 tribe groupings. (P20)
- Place 4 tribe groupings on the Main Page in the following placement:

> East side: Yissaskar, Yehudah, Zebulun

West side: Binyamin, Ephrayim,

Menashsheh (P22)

Asher, Dan, Naphtali (P23) > North side: > South side: Gad, Re'uben, Shim'on (P24)

• 12 cupcakes or muffins (mini or regular size)


Instructions:

You can have your child color the banners and cut them. Take 12 toothpicks and tape them around the banners so that you can insert them into your cupcakes or muffins.


This snack can be used as an educational tool so that your child learns the placement of the tribes of Yisra'el around the Dwelling Place.
