LITTLE GEMS STORY

Becoming a Set-apart People

Shalom children! We are back with the Yisra'elites this week as they are preparing to enter the land. This time, Yahweh has instructions for them on how to present their first-fruits and tithes, and how to take care of Lewites, sojourners, the fatherless, and widows that live within their gates. (Place people on board.)

Do you remember some of the other stories that we have read this year that talked about tithing? Do any of you remember how much a tithe is? (Give children a chance to answer.) Yes, a tithe is a tenth. Today we are going to talk about the 3rd year tithe. But first, let's go over how Yahweh wants them to present their first-fruits.

Who wants to make a guess as to what first-fruits are? (Let children answer.) Well, if you had produce that you grew from plants in the soil, and you took out some of the first ones that grew, those would be first-fruits. (Place first-fruits on board.) Well, Yahweh says that those first-fruits should be put into a basket and taken to the place where He chooses to make His Name dwell. (Place basket of first-fruits on board.) Then the Yisra'elite who is bringing the basket goes up to the priest and tells him that he has come to the land that Yahweh promised to them. (Place priest on board.) The priest takes the basket and puts it before the altar. (Place altar on board.) Then the Yisra'elite is supposed to say a few things out loud to the priest to show appreciation and remembrance for all that Yahweh has given him. After his speech, the Yisra'elite then puts the first-fruits before Yahweh and bows down to Him. (Place bowing man on board.)

Yahweh wants the children of Yisra'el to rejoice because there is so much good that has come to them and the Lewites, and even to the sojourners who live among them. (Place happy Yisra'elites on board and point to Lewite and sojourner.)

Okay, so now let's talk about the 3rd year tithe. The Yisra'elites are taught that every 3 years, a tithe is supposed to go towards taking care of the Lewites, the sojourners, the fatherless, and the widows that are in their gates. (Point to people on board.) Once they have brought this tithe, Yahweh has some more things that He wants them to say out loud.


He wants them to declare that:


- They took the set-apart portion and gave it to the Lewite, the sojourner, the fatherless, and the widow just as He told commanded (point to people)
- They did not break His commands or forget about them (place tablets on board)
- They did not eat any of it when they were sad and mourning (place sad Yisr'aelites on board)
- They did not use any of it for something unclean (place pot with dead mouse on board)
- They did not give any of it for people who are dead (place dead people on board)
- They obeyed Yahweh (point to tablets)
- They did what Yahweh commanded them to do (point to tablets)
- And they want Yahweh to look down and bless them and bless the land that He has given them (place land of Kena'an scene on board)

Wow! Did you notice that when they present both the first-fruits and the 3rd year tithe, they have a list of things they are required to say? I wonder why Yahweh would want them to recite that big, long list. Do you think He wants them to make sure they remember these things and are doing all of it just the way that He said to do? Well, Mosheh tells all the people that these are in fact the things that Yahweh is commanding them to do, and that they need to guard them and do them with all their heart and their being. Wait a minute... all your heart and all your being? Where have we heard that before? In the V'ahavta! Can any of you say the line with me? (Recite slowly.) "And you shall love Yahweh your Elohim with all your heart, and with all your being, and with all your might!" Yahweh reminds them that they are His people and His treasured possession, and so He wants them to guard all of these commands. And because they are His set-apart people, He has made amazing promises to them when they do. That is so exciting!

Well children, we have come to the end of our story for today. We will see you next week for another exciting Little Gems story!

















Print Craft Templates on cardstock.



Instructions for the Craft:

- If using BW Templates, color using medium of choice.
- Cut out all Craft Templates. (P1)
- Using a ruler, fold the tabs inward on the basket template. (P2a, P2b, P2c)
- Run double-sided tape onto the back of the tabs. (P3)
- Place the basket with tabs over the handle template. (P4)

Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

- Fold the bottom tab over the handle template. (P5)
- Fold the side tabs over the handle template.
 (P6)
- Your basket is now ready to place your firstfruits in it. (P7)
- We added the taller grains in the basket first, then the rest according to size and visibility. (P8a, P8b, P8c, P8d)
- You can also glue the first-fruits into the basket if desired so that they don't move.

You now have a visual representation of a basket that an offeror would bring to the priest with some depictions of first-fruits in it.

CRAFT

Materials:

- Cardstock white
- Beads green (for olives) or as desired to give 3-D effect
- Pom poms purple (for grapes) or as desired to give 3-D effect
- Puffy paint brown (for dates), purple (for figs) or colors of choice to enhance the images
- Glitter glue gold (for oil bottle) or as desired
- Double-sided foam dimensionals as desired to give 3-D effect
- · Glue of choice
- Scissors
- · Coloring pencils, crayons, or markers
- Craft Templates: Main Page & A (BW) or Main Page & B (color)

Parent/Teacher Preparation:

Print Craft Templates on cardstock.

Instructions for the Craft:

- If using BW Templates, color using medium of choice.
- Cut out all Craft Templates. (P1)
- You can glue all the Templates to the page as is or enhance them before adding to the Main Page.
- We did the following:

Wine Bottles and Oil Jar

- Place double-sided foam dimensionals on the back of the wine bottle and oil jar. (P2)
- Use gold glitter glue to enhance the olive oil jar. (P3)
- Set olive oil jar aside to dry.
- Add to Main Page on both sides of the basket. (P4)

Pomegranate


- Run glue on the pomegranate and place red beads in the seed (arial) area. (P5)
- Set pomegranate aside to dry.
- Place a double-sided foam dimensional on the right side of the basket and lay the pomegranate over it. (P6a, P6b)



Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

Dates

- Using brown puffy paint, add dimension to the dates. (P7)
- Set dates aside to dry.
- Run glue on the back of the dates and place on the Main Page below the basket. (P8a, P8b)

Grapes

- Run glue on the grapes and place purple pom poms onto the glue. (P9a, P9b)
- Set grapes aside to dry.
- Place a double-sided foam dimensional on the left side of the basket and lay the grape over it. (P10a, P10b)


Olives

- Run glue on the olives and place green craft pearl beads on the glue. (P11a, P11b)
- Set olives aside to dry.
- Run glue on the back of the olives and place on Main Page below the dates. (P12a, P12b)

Figs

- Using purple puffy paint, add dimension to the figs. (P13)
- Set figs aside to dry.
- Place a double-sided foam dimensional on the back of the figs and place on Main Page to the left and below the grapes. (P14a, P14b)







Hayom hazeh nihyesa le'am - "This day you have become the people of Yahweh your Elohim" (Deut. 27:9)




SWEET TASTE OF TORAH

Instructions:


Cut the cookies in half. Cut rope or string candy to desired length. Attach the rope or string candy handles by inserting into vanilla cream.
