

# **Special Feast Edition**

## INTRODUCTION

This Parsha Pearls Feast Edition is designed specifically for Chag HaSukkot - the Feast of Tabernacles, and Shemini Atzeret - the 8<sup>th</sup> Day Assembly. In Leviticus 23:1-2, Yahweh told Mosheh to speak to the children of Yisra'el about His appointed times (moadim), which they were to keep as set-apart gatherings (mikra kodesh). Three times each year, the children of Yisra'el were required to travel to Yerushalayim (Jerusalem) to observe one of the 3 pilgrimage feasts (shalosh regalim).

#### The 3 spring festivals are:

- 1. Passover (Pesach)
- 2. Festival of Unleavened Bread (Chag HaMatzot), which immediately follows Passover
- 3. Feast of Weeks (Chag HaShavuot)

#### The 4 autumn festivals are:

- 1. Day of Trumpets (Yom Teruah/Zichron Teruah/Rosh HaShanah)
- 2. Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur), Day of Atonements (Yom HaKippurim)
- 3. Feast of Tabernacles (Chag HaSukkot)
- 4. 8th day Assembly (Shemini Atzeret), which immediately follows Sukkot



Sukkot is the 6<sup>th</sup> appointed time (moad) of the year. According to Yahweh's calendar, it is observed for 7 days from the 15<sup>th</sup> to the 21<sup>st</sup> day of the 7<sup>th</sup> month of Tishrei. It is commonly referred to as the Feast of Tabernacles or Booths. "Speak to the children of Yisra'el, saying, 'On the 15<sup>th</sup> day of this 7<sup>th</sup> month (new moon) is the Festival of Booths (Festival of Sukkot) for 7 days to Yahweh. On the 1<sup>st</sup> day is a set-apart gathering (mikra kodesh), you do no servile work. For 7 days you bring an offering made by fire to Yahweh'" (Lev. 23:34-36).



Shemini Atzeret also known as The 8<sup>th</sup> Day Assembly or The Last Great Day, immediately follows the Feast of Tabernacles and is a concluding festival. It is the 7<sup>th</sup> appointed time (moad) of the year. According to Yahweh's calendar, it falls on the  $22^{nd}$  day of the 7<sup>th</sup> month of Tishrei. "On the 8<sup>th</sup> day there shall be a set-apart gathering (mikra kodesh) for you, and you shall bring an offering made by fire to Yahweh. It is a closing festival; you do no servile work" (Lev. 23:36).

Leviticus 23:39 also tells us, "On the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 7<sup>th</sup> month (new moon), when you gather in the fruit of the land, celebrate the festival of Yahweh for 7 days. On the 1<sup>st</sup> day is a rest, and on the 8<sup>th</sup> day a rest."

These festivals were commanded by Yahweh to be kept by the children of Yisra'el throughout their generations, and that is why we are observing them as well (Lev. 23).

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# Pearl Seeking

## TREASURING HIS WORD

Yahweh gave the children of Yisra'el specific instructions regarding His Appointed Times. The command to keep Yahweh's back-to-back festivals of Sukkot and Shemini Atzeret, the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> feasts, can be found in Lev. 23:33-36 & 39-44. We have created a special Parsha Pearls lessons to help us learn about and celebrate the festival of Sukkot.

## PARSHA POINTS

- Yahweh spoke to Mosheh and commanded him to tell the children of Yisra'el these words (Lev. 23:33-36, 39, 41; Num. 29:12, 35):
  - > On the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 7<sup>th</sup> month is the Festival of Booths (Sukkot)
  - > It is observed for 7 (sheva) days unto Yahweh
  - > The 1<sup>st</sup> day is a set-apart day; you do no servile work
  - > You shall bring an offering made by fire to Yahweh for 7 days
  - > The 8<sup>th</sup> day is a set-apart day; you do no servile work
  - > The 8<sup>th</sup> day is a closing festival
  - > You shall bring an offering made by fire to Yahweh
  - > You shall observe this festival as a law forever throughout your generations
  - > For 7 days you dwell in booths all who are native Yisra'elites

### Arba'ah Minim

- On the  $1^{\mbox{\tiny st}}$  day of Sukkot, you shall take for yourselves (Lev. 23:40):
  - > the fruit/citron of good trees (etrog)
  - branches of palm trees (lulav)
  - > twigs of leafy trees/myrtle (hadasim)
  - willows of the stream (aravot)

### Fun Facts regarding the 4 Species

- Etrog the shape of the citron fruit resembles the heart the driving force behind all our actions
- Lulav the palm branch resembles the spine, which holds the body together and without which we would be unable to move
- Hadasim the almond-shape of myrtle leaves, resemble the eyes, with which we behold Yahweh's Creation
- Aravot the willow branches resemble the lips, with which we give expression to our thoughts and feelings







- You shall rejoice before Yahweh your Elohim for 7 days Lev. 23:40; Deut. 16:14
- You shall know that Yahweh made you dwell in booths when He brought you out of Mitsrayim - Lev. 23:43
- Yahweh specified that the following people are to rejoice before Him (Deut. 16:14):
  - > you
  - > your son
  - your daughter
  - your male servant
  - your female servant
  - the Lewite
  - the stranger
  - the fatherless
  - the widow
  - all those within your gates
- For 7 days the festival shall be observed unto Yahweh in the place which He chooses - Deut. 16:15
- You shall rejoice for the blessing that Yahweh gives in the increase and in all the work of your hands - Deut. 16:15



• Guard the Festival of In-gathering at the outgoing or turn of the year when you have gathered in the fruit of your labors from the field - Ex. 23:16; 34:22-23; Deut. 16:13

## Public hearing of the Torah every 7 years during the Festival of Sukkot

- Mosheh commanded them, saying, "At the end of 7 years, the year of release, at the Festival of Booths, when all Yisra'el comes before Yahweh your Elohim *in the place which He chooses*, read this Torah before all Yisra'el in their hearing" to (Deut. 31:10-13):
  - > the men
  - the women
  - $\succ$  the little ones
  - > the sojourner who is within your gates
- They are to hear this so that they learn to fear Yahweh Elohim and to guard to do all the Words of this Torah -Deut. 31:12
- Day by day, from the 1<sup>st</sup> day until the Last Day, Ezra read from the Book of the Torah of Elohim - Neh. 8:18






### Chag HaSukkot Offerings/Feast of Tabernacles

\*Refer to Leviticus 28-29 in parsha Pinchas (41.2) for an in depth study on feast offerings.

- Burnt Offering for each of the 7 days (Num. 29:12-32, 2 Chr. 8:12-13, Ezr. 3:4):
  - > 13 (shlosh esre) young bulls Day 1
  - > 12 (shtem esre) young bulls Day 2
  - > 11 (achat esre) young bulls Day 3
  - > 10 (eser) young bulls Day 4
  - 9 (tesha) young bulls Day 5
  - > 8 (shmoneh) young bulls Day 6
  - > 7 young bulls Day 7
  - > 2 (shtayim) rams each day
  - > 14 (arba esre) lambs a year old perfect ones, each day
- Grain Offering for each of the 7 days (Num. 29:33):
  - > 3/10<sup>th</sup> of an ephah of fine flour, mixed with oil for each bull
  - > 2/10<sup>th</sup> of an ephah of fine flour, mixed with oil for each ram
  - > 1/10<sup>th</sup> of an ephah of fine flour, mixed with oil for each lamb
- Sin Offering for each of the 7 days (Num. 29:34):
  - > 1 (achat) male goat to make atonement for you
- The Sukkot offerings are in addition to the daily offering and its grain and drink offering Num. 29:16, 19, 22, 25, 28, 34
- These are ascending offerings made by fire for 7 days, a sweet fragrance to Yahweh - Num. 29:36

### Shemini Atzeret/8<sup>th</sup> Day Assembly Offerings

- Burnt Offering (Num. 29:36):
  - > 1 young bull
  - > 1 ram
  - > 7 lambs a year old perfect ones
- Grain and Drink Offering (Num. 29:37):
  - > 3/10<sup>th</sup> of an ephah of fine flour, mixed with oil for each bull
  - > 2/10<sup>th</sup> of an ephah of fine flour, mixed with oil for each ram
  - > 1/10<sup>th</sup> of an ephah of fine flour, mixed with oil for each lamb
- Sin Offering (Num. 29:38):
  - I male goat to make atonement for you
- The 8<sup>th</sup> Day Assembly offering is in addition to the daily offering - Num. 29:38

## **DIGGING DEEPER**

Read Neh. 8:14-18 - the account of Ezra reading the Torah to the children of Yisra'el during the festival of Sukkot. Discuss the significance of this event.


As a contrast, read 1 Kings 12:32-33 - the account of Yarob'am (Jeroboam) the king of Yisra'el, who instituted a feast in the 8<sup>th</sup> month on the 15<sup>th</sup> day instead of the 7<sup>th</sup> month as Yahweh had instructed. What does it say about the condition of his heart?

It is understood that Sukkot represents the millennial reign. Read passages in Isaiah that describe the millennium (Isa, 2:1-4, 11:6-9, 35:1-10, 65:25). Also refer to Zech, 14:16-19. What is the punishment for not observing the festival of Sukkot during the millennium?

Read the verses in the Gospel of John 7:2, 37 which refer to Yeshua's observance of Sukkot and the 8<sup>th</sup> day Assembly.

Discuss why Yahweh would want us to dwell in temporary dwellings during the week of Sukkot. Refer to Heb. 11:3. Does He perhaps want us to remember that we are strangers and pilgrims in this world?

It is understood that the 8<sup>th</sup> Day Assembly, or the Last Great Day, represents the Great White Throne Judgment. Read the passage in Rev. 20:11-15 which refers to this.

## **NOTEBOOK PAGE**

### **Materials**:

- Cardstock white
- Foam dark & light green (for leaves), yellow (for etrog)
- Construction paper tan or light brown (for strips)
- Paper towel roll or flexible brown cardboard
- Velcro dots
- Scissors
- Craft scissors: zigzag pattern
- Tacky glue or glue
- Double-sided tape
- Brown coloring pencil or marker (to create basket weave look and to shade etrog stem)
- Notebook Templates: Main Page & A

#### Parent/Teacher Preparation:

Print Main Page and Template A on white cardstock.

### Instructions for the Notebook Page:

• Cut out Template A pieces. (P1)

#### To Create the Lulav Holder

- Fold the tabs on the 'lulav backing' cardstock piece. This will create a pocket to insert the 3 lulav branches into. (P2)
- Place the 'lulav holder strip' template over tan or beige colored construction paper and cut out 11 strips. (P3)
- Lay 6 strips over the 'lulav backing' vertically on the front side. Lay the strips so that the ends at the top are exactly to the edge of the 'lulav backing'. Tape each strip to the back of the 'lulav backing'. (P4)
- You will have overhang at the bottom. Fold to the back. Trim and tape the bottom ends to the back of the pocket.




















### Instructions for the Notebook Page Cont'd:

• Take your 5 remaining strips and weave them through the vertical strips starting at the top and leaving some space between them from top to bottom. (P5a, P5b, P5c)




- Fold the overhang strips to the back of the pockets. Trim and tape the ends to the back of the side pockets. (P7)
- If desired, use a brown coloring pencil or marker to create a basket weave look. (P8)

#### Attaching the Lulav Holder

- Adhere double-sided tape to the sides and bottom of the tabs on the back of the 'lulay backing'.
- Place the completed 'lulav holder' onto the diagonal rectangle on the Main Page. (P9)


#### To Create the Lulav

- Using a paper towel roll or flexible brown cardboard, cut out 3 strips  $\frac{3}{4}$ " wide. These will become the 'willow' and 'myrtle' branches and the 'palm' frond.
- Using zigzag craft scissors, cut the sides of 1 of the strips and create a diagonal cut at the top. You will have zigzag patterns on the sides and top of the 'palm' frond. (P10)
- You will use the 2 straight pieces for the 'willow' and 'myrtle' branches and the zigzag piece for the 'palm' frond. (P11)
- Using your 'willow leaf' and 'myrtle leaf' templates, cut out leaves from dark green and light green foam. We made about 12 leaves for the 'willow' branch and 24 for the 'myrtle' branch. (P12)
- For the 'willow' leaves, use your zigzag craft scissors around the leaves. (P12)

### Instructions for the Notebook Page Cont'd:

- Glue your foam leaves to the 'willow' and 'myrtle' branches. (P13)
- The 'palm' frond will not have any leaves on it.
- Place the 3 branches inside the Lulav Holder. (P14)
  - The lulav/לולב/palm should be placed in the middle.
  - The aravot/ערבות/willow should be placed on the left side.
  - The hadasim/הדסים/myrtle should be placed on the right side.

#### To Create the Etrog

• Take your 'etrog' template and cut out the citron fruit using yellow foam. (P15)



### Instructions for the Notebook Page Cont'd:

- Using a brown coloring pencil or marker, color in the stem on the 'etrog'. (P20)
- Glue or attach the soft or 'loop' side of the hook and loop Velcro to the back of the 'etrog'. (P21)
- Glue or attach the hard or 'hook' side of the hook and loop *Velcro* to the Main Page toward the right side of the lulav. (P21)
- Attach the 'etrog' to the Main Page. (P22)
- The 4 Species (arba'ah minim) can be removed if desired to be used as interactive pieces.

You now have a visual of the instruction to take the fruit of good trees and branches of palm trees, leafy trees and willows of the stream for celebrating Sukkot.








## **Parent/Teacher Preparation:**

Twine

Materials:

Cardstock - white

Skinny sticks - (33)

· Hot glue or Tacky glue

Plastic greenery (to cover roof)

· Coloring pencils, crayons or markers

Craft Template: A (BW or color)

Print Craft Template of choice on white cardstock.

• Optional: fruit & vegetable stickers (to hang as decorations) • Optional: sandpaper (to smooth the dowels after they are cut)

• Optional: clamp (to hold dowels together while drying to strengthen bond)

Dowels - 3/8" cut into (4) 8" long & (4) 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" long

- Gather and cut all the dowels and skinny sticks. (P1)
- · Sand the ends of the dowels if desired. This may help in them adhering better to each other when adding glue.

## Instructions for the Craft:

• If using BW Templates, color using medium of choice.

This is an alternative craft to the Notebook Page to be used as an interactive and decorative piece to enhance your Sukkot experience. Parents can choose to do this with their children during the festival as a


- Cut out all Template pieces. (P2)
- Lay aside for now.

### Assembling the Left and Right Walls

- Arrange 2 of the 8" dowels and 2 of the  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " dowels on a table to make a rectangle. This will be one of the side walls. (P3)
- Note that one of the  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " dowels will not be glued at the end. It can be placed about 2" inside the rectangle at the open end. This is just a place holder for now.
- Apply Tacky glue to the ends of one of the 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" dowel and connect it to the ends of the 8" dowels.
- Hold firmly together or use clamps and allow to dry. (P4)
- At the open end of the rectangle, glue one skinny stick onto the top. (P5a, P5b)

### Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

- Place another skinny stick against the glued one to use as a spacer.
- Now glue another skinny stick onto the top next to the spacer.
- Continue this pattern of the skinny sticks spacer and glue sticks until you have added 8 glued sticks. Be careful not to glue the spacer. You can remove the 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " dowel at this point as it is not needed for a space holder. (P6a, P6b, P6c, P6d)
- Repeat these steps for the other wall.
- Allow both walls to dry. You can use clamps at this point to assist in the bonding process. (P7a, P7b)

#### Assembling the Roof

- Apply Tacky glue to the ends of 2 of the  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " dowels.
- Place the 2 dowels onto the ends of one of the side walls at the top away from the skinny sticks. (P8)
- Apply Tacky glue at the other end of the 2  $5\frac{1}{4}$ dowels. (P9a, P9b)
- Now take your other wall piece and place it over the glue at the top. (P10a, P10b)
- Allow to dry. (P10b)

#### Assembling the Back Wall


- Lay the front of the Sukkah face down. At this point it doesn't matter which side you choose to be the front or the back. (P11)
- Apply Tacky glue to the ends of a skinny stick and adhere to the back of the Sukkah at the bottom.
- Now as you did with the side walls, lay a skinny stick against the glued one to use as a spacer.
- Glue another skinny stick next to the spacer.
- Continue with this pattern until you have added 8 glued sticks taking care not to glue the spacer. (P12a, P12b)
- Allow the back wall to dry.

### Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

#### Adding Skinny Sticks to the Beams of the Sukkah

- Apply Tacky glue to a skinny stick and adhere the stick to the following areas:
  - back wall of the Sukkah over the top beam (P13a, P13b)
  - > side walls of the Sukkah over the top beam (P14a, P14b, P14c)
  - Front of the Sukkah over the top beam (P15)

#### Adding Skinny Sticks to the Roof of the Sukkah

- Evenly space and glue 4 skinny sticks across the top/roof of the Sukkah. (P16a, P16b)
- Lay Sukkah on its back and glue 1 more skinny stick onto the front of the Sukkah below the top beam. (P17)
- Leave the rest of the front open.
- Allow to dry.

#### Decorating the Sukkah

- Using a puncturing tool or a needle, poke a hole through the 7 Species Sukkah decorations. (P18)
- Thread 4" colored string or twine through each hole. (P19)
- Tie the strings or twine to the roof beams of the Sukkah. (P20a P20b)
- Lay plastic greenery pieces over the roof. If desired, you can glue the greenery to the roof to keep them from falling off. (P21a, P21b)

You now have a visual representation of a Sukkah which the children of Yisra'el were commanded to dwell in during the festival.







## CRAFT

### **Materials**:

- Cardstock white
- Aluminum foil heavy duty
- Hole punch
- Yarn or string of choice
- Hot glue gun
- Glue or clear tape to secure aluminum foil on the back of the flowers
- Scissors
- Markers
- Craft Templates: Date Flower, Etrog Flower, Pomegranate Flower

#### Parent/Teacher Preparation:

• Print Craft Template of choice on white cardstock.


### Instructions for the Craft:

- Cut out Craft Template. (P1)
- Using a hot glue gun, outline all the lines on the flower. (P2)
- Tear off a piece of heavy-duty aluminum foil wide enough to go over the front and around some of the back of the flower making sure that the non-shiny side is facing up. (P3)
- Press down on the flower to make indentations on the aluminum foil. Flip flower to the front and with the pad of your index finger, gently make deeper pressings in the foil to show the pattern, being careful not to tear the aluminum foil. (P4a, P4b, P4c)
- Cut in between the flower pedals so that you can start bringing the foil over to the back side. (P5a, P5b, P5c)

### Instructions for the Craft Cont'd:

- You may need to add more pieces of foil to cover the whole back of the flower. (P6a, P6b, P6c)
- Using marker colors of choice, color the aluminum foil in between the raised hot glue on the flowers. (P7a, P7b, P7c)
- Allow ink on markers to dry. (P8a, P8b, P8c)
- Using a hole punch, make a hole at the top of the flower. (P9a, P9b, P9c)
- Tie a piece of yarn or string through the hole so that you can hang it from the tree branches over the sukkah. (P10a, P10b, P10c)

Enjoy hanging these flowers in your Sukkah to enhance the week-long festival.

## SWEET TASTE OF TORAH

This snack relates to this week's lesson. Please take these as suggestions and make necessary changes based on your individual dietary needs.

#### Edible Sukkah Lev. 23:42



### Ingredients:

- Graham crackers (for sukkah walls)
- Pretzel rods (for roof branches-approx. 3-4)
- Marshmallow fluff (used as adhesive)
- Candies of choice (for sukkah decorations)
- Coconut flakes (for roof)
- Green food coloring (for coconut flakes)
- Optional: Green frosting to create grass

### Instructions:

- 1. Assemble your walls using Graham crackers and marshmallow fluff as adhesive.
- 2. Spread marshmallow fluff onto one side of your pretzel rod and sprinkle your green coconut flakes over the fluff to adhere leaves to your branches. Do this for all your pretzel rods.
- 3. Lay pretzel rods gently over your sukkah walls.
- 4. Using candies of choice, place them over your roof. You may use marshmallow fluff to adhere the candies to the roof.
- 5. You can also make a table and chairs as well for the inside of your sukkah using *Graham crackers* or square pretzels to invite ushpizin (guests) over.
- 6. Lay a yellow candy on your table to represent the etrog and a pretzel stick to represent the lulav.
- 7. We used green frosting to represent grass but also as extra reinforcement for the walls and table. Our sukkah wasn't large enough to make chairs but you can make your back wall longer by using more *Graham crackers*.
