Notebook Page Instructions

Eagle

Deuteronomy 32:11

Materials:

- Copy paper
- Card stock - light blue
- Craft foam - black
- Craft foam - white
- Small pieces of craft foam - orange or yellow
- Brown butcher paper or a brown paper bag
- Sticks from your yard
- Brads
- Hot glue
- Coloring pencils, crayons or markers
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Notebook Templates: Main Page & A



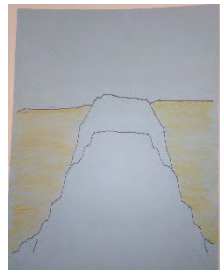
Parent/Teacher Preparation:

- Print the Main Page on light blue card stock as well as on copy paper (2 copies total). If blue card stock is not available, it can be printed on white card stock.
- Print Notebook Template A on copy paper.

Instructions for the Notebook page:

- If using blue card stock, color the land on both sides of the mountain. This will be used as your Main Page. (P1)
- Cut out the mountain from the copy paper. This will be used as a template. (P2)
- Trace the mountain on a piece of brown butcher paper or a paper bag. Set it aside. (P2)
- Cut the upper part of the mountain off the copy paper and trace the smaller mountain on a different piece of butcher paper or paper bag. (P3)
- Cut both pieces of the mountain from the brown paper. (P4)
- Crumble the pieces and smooth them back out. This will give the paper a rough texture look. (P4)

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Notebook Page - page 2:

Instructions for the Notebook page cont'd:

- The mountain pieces will be a little bit larger than the ones on the blue card stock. Take the hot glue and begin putting a little bit of hot glue starting at the top of the mountain and going down one side. Start pressing the larger mountain piece on the glue and continue doing this until the large mountain piece is glued to the page. (P5)
- The second piece will be glued to the larger mountain. Just begin putting glue on the mountain and gluing the smaller mountain piece in the same manner you did the larger mountain except on top of the large mountain. (P6)
- Both mountain pieces should bubble out some to give it a 3D effect. (P6)
- Take sticks and begin building a nest on top of the smaller mountain. (P6) There is no set way on how to do this, just begin gluing one stick at a time as they fit until you have the desired look. Set the page aside.
- Cut out all the pieces on Notebook Template A, do NOT color them, P8 they will be used to trace on the craft foam. (P7)
- Trace the 4 wing pieces, and the body (the oval) on black craft foam. Cut out all the pieces. Set them aside. (P8)
- Trace the head and tail pieces on white craft foam. Cut them out and set them aside. (P9)
- Cut 2 small baby bird shapes out of the scraps from the black craft foam. (P10)
- Cut a beak for the eagle and small little triangles for the beaks for the baby birds from the orange craft foam. (P11)

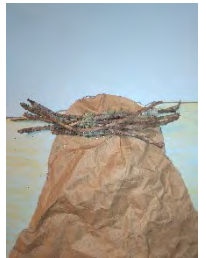
Assemble the Eagle

- Take left wing 1 and place the inside wing section behind the eagle's body, so that the tip comes to just the bottom of the eagle's body. Push a brad on the upper part of the body through the wing. Open legs to fasten.
- Take left wing 2 and align it with the outside of wing 1 section. Place a brad at the top of the wing where both pieces meet.
- Repeat for the other wing.
- The wings should be able to move and spread apart. Be careful not to pull hard. (P12)

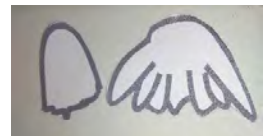

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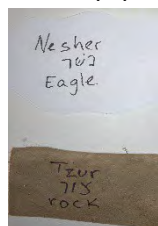
Notebook Page - page 3:

Instructions for the Notebook page cont'd:

- Glue the head to the top front of the body. (P13)
- Glue the tail to the bottom back of the body. (P13)
- Glue the beak in place. (P14)
- Draw some eyes on the eagle's face, and some feathers on the head and tail. (P14)
- Set eagle aside.
- Glue the orange triangles which represent the beak to top of the baby birds you made. (P14, 15)
- Glue the baby birds in the nest. (P15)
- Turn your page face down; place the eagle on the top edge of the paper so the brads can be seen on the top. Make a mark to see how far the brads are from each other. (P16)
- Cut 2 slits right on the marks from above. Should be about $\frac{1}{2}$ " apart and about 2" down. Make sure you do NOT make the slits too far down. (P17)
- Slide the brads on the eagle's torso onto the slits. This part may need to be completed by an adult. But also make sure the eagle can move up and down on the slits. (P18)
- Cut 3 pieces of scraps of card stock large enough to write Hebrew words for this week. Optional: use a scrap piece from the paper bag for the word 'rock.' (P19)

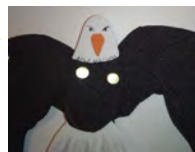
